We find ourselves at the beginning of the new church year—Advent 2020. It feels a little subdued and uncertain as we are still in the grip of the pandemic. Our Advent and Christmas celebrations are going to be therefore very different.

As mentioned last month, our Facebook Advent calendar—with 'windows' (i.e. videos) coming from members of all three congregations worshipping together online (Kirkwall East, Shapinsay and Moncur Memorial Stronsay) - is live. Check the contributions every day throughout Advent. If you do not have access to Facebook and would like a printed copy of some of the contributions (poems or reflections, clearly pieces of music cannot be included), please contact Julia.

Sunday 'windows' are going to be joint Kirkwall Council of Churches services prepared by ministers, priests and church leaders from the 8 churches in Kirkwall. We hope you can join us in worship every Sunday. You can access our services in any one of four ways:

- * By dialling 01856 404667 from your phone and listening to the audio recording of the service. You will be charged as you would normally be for a local phone call (and that of course depends on your contract).
- By getting a script of the service by e-mail (do contact Julia if you would like that).

In addition to this, we are going to offer 2 Zoom services: the loss service (joint with the Peedie Kirk and the Cathedral) on the 7th December at 6 pm and the Christmas Eve one on the 24th December at 7 pm. Details of how to join both services are in this newsletter.

The team has identified a farm where about 20 children are suspected to be planting and picking cotton. We attempted to investigate the farm and rescue the children last week, but there was a tip-off on the case and the children were not present when our team arrived.

Please pray as we re-strategise and work to bring these kids to safety soon.

I promised to get back to you once we had held an Orkney Guilds Together meeting. The meeting took place on Thursday 5th November. Time does seem to

The meeting carried a positive note and ways to keep in touch with our respective Guilds were spoken about.

The biggest issue was indeed the question of capitation fees.

Although we cannot meet together as a Guild, work is continuing at Head Office level where theme packs are being prepared for 2021-2022 and applications for possible new projects are being invited. To help enable the continuation of this work along with online virtual events, National Reps have been asked to encourage Guild members to pay their fees for the current session 2020-2021. The fees have been reduced from £12.00 to £9.00 as we have been unable to hold meetings. No fees will be paid to Orkney Guilds Together this year where normally £2 per member is paid.

We (Anne Findlay or myself) will contact each of you individually once Christmas and the New Year are behind us and make a plan as to how best to collect money from those of you who wish to pay.

Sadly it now seems extremely unlikely that we will be able to meet together over the Christmas season. This does not mean that we won't be in each other's thoughts.



Request for assistance

Dear all,

My name is Luigi and I am a Sustainable Development student currently in the process of completing my fourth year at the University of the Highlands and Islands.

The following questionnaire has been designed by me with the support of Rebecca Smith, my tutor and supervisor for this project. This dissertation is aiming to explore the relationship between religion and willingness to adopt sustainable practices, with a special focus on Christianity in Orkney. I wish to be able to reach as many Christians in Orkney in order to improve the accuracy of the study.

The first section of the survey is dedicated to collecting general information about the participant (gender and age group) and their religious, political and moral views (Christian denomination, Biblical interpretation, political and moral orientation). These factors will be tested to identify any correlation with the 10 criteria present in the second section which were chosen as representative of the willingness to adopt sustainable practices.


The final total for the Christian Aid Smartie tubes collection is £2,076.14. The gift aid forms totalled £407 so we'll get a bit back from that too.
