

## Mull Head Local Nature Reserve Access and Interpretation Project

### Summary

The Council wishes to enhance visitor experience in the Mull Head LNR by installing the following:

- Lengths (90m x 1m in total) of boardwalk at various points along the path.
- A GPS-based interpretation app which would provide information, accessible on the visitor's smartphone, at 20 points of interest throughout the reserve. Numbered posts would guide the visitor along the information trail; some of these would also include numbers making up Lat and Long coordinates as part of a Geocaching treasure hunt.
- Six finger-post way markers to keep visitors on the correct path, avoiding damage to heathland vegetation or disturbance to nesting birds
- Six hazard signs to warn visitors of proximity to dangerous cliffs.
- A new sign at the entrance to the visitor centre access track.
- Two galvanised gates to enable sheep to be driven along a safe route into the reserve for grazing.
- One galvanised self-closing pedestrian gate in a fence at the southern end of the reserve.
- Produce and print a new Mull Head leaflet.
- Install two interpretation boards in the car park.

Bird and plant identification quiz sheets will be available in the visitor centre; however, these would be funded by the Council.

### Project Aims

- Improve access to Mull Head LNR
- Improve the provision of interpretation
- Improve signage
- Make provision to enable conservation grazing of maritime grassland
