Orkney Disability Forum A local independent charity

Life on Orkney has challenges. Especially for people with mobility issues. Orkney Disability Forum was started in 1991 to find ways to improve their quality of life.

We are run by a board of trustees, who are volunteers and employ a manager along with other staff to carry out the aims of the charity. Dial-a-Bus was started in 1996 to respond to the need for transport.

What do we do?

Advice and Information

We give information on disability issues to anyone, whether it be to someone with mobility issues, a family member, a carer or an organisation. We help to source equipment and signpost people to other services that may help to make their life easier. We have information on legislation and we try to educate the public about disabilities.



Dial-a-Bus

Dial-a-Bus is a door to door accessible bus service for elderly and disabled people in Orkney. Members pay a yearly membership fee then request journeys and are taken by our MiDAS trained drivers. Orkney Islands Council's concessionary travel scheme gives them three free return journeys per calendar month then they pay for any extra journeys. The bus is used for anything, such as shopping, visiting family or friends or to go to local events.

We also use our specialised buses for transport to local events and tours arranged by our Social Inclusion Worker.

Social Activities

The Tuesday Club has a programme for adults with disabilities and organises activities, trips and gives them the opportunity to socialise.

Mobility Scooter & Wheelchair Hire

We have a range of manual and electric wheelchairs and mobility scooters—available for hire. People can hire these for part of day or for long term hire. We are also agents for DRIVE and can supply equipment for those who prefer to buy—rather than hire.

Disability Living Aids

We stock a wide range of independent living aids for sale and to make life easier in and around the home. These items include rollators, long handled sponges, jar openers, grabbing tools and much more besides.

Training

We run training courses for Minibus Drivers focused on disability (MiDAS) courses. We also run WTORS equipment training course (Wheelchair and Tie Downs Occupant Restraint System) and a Disability Awareness course that can be tailored to meet organisational needs.





How did Dial-a-bus start and what do we do now?

In 1995, it was agreed that there was a demand for an accessible transport service for those with mobility issues and Orkney Disability Forum was approached to run the service as a one-year pilot. The aim was to provide a transport service in Orkney which would meet the needs of people with disabilities for shopping, social and leisure purposes. It was hoped that in the future the scheme could expand to include elderly people and those that live in rural areas.

The service was launched on 17th August 1996 with a small minibus loaned from Orkney Islands Council. Dial-a-bus managed to get further funding and later purchased their own wheelchair accessible vehicle and 2 mobility scooters.

The service has gone from strength to strength and now has over 300 members. Many find the service indispensable and would be isolated without the service.

In 2022 (26 years later), we own 4 wheelchair accessible minibuses along with 2 smaller vehicles and 2 electric cars. We take people shopping, to medical appointments, to church, visiting, day care and even to exercise classes and lots more besides.

Many of our passengers enjoyed meeting people on the bus and we recognised this as an important way of tackling loneliness. In 2004, we decided to trail organised trips that allowed people to be picked up from their doors and have a day out with other people, visiting places, having a meal out and experiencing new things. These outings are now often the highlight of the summer for many people and some describe it as their summer holidays as they are no longer able to travel out of Orkney. We recruited volunteer drivers and escorts to help keep costs down for passengers.

In recent years we have provided transport to community events so that our passengers know they are going to be in the company of familiar faces when they attend. This can be the agricultural shows, a concert, the science festival or just our own fundraising events such as coffee mornings. We also provide a dedicated weekly shopping in Company bus, where one week per month the passengers choose an out of town shop to go to. (Stromness, Dounby, St Margarets Hope).

What do we plan to for the future?

The elderly and those with mobility issues often face social isolation and Dial-a-bus are working hard to tackle this. People who can't get out to meet people often suffer from poor mental health, frequently resulting in their physical health also suffering. We help these people to stay independent and this enables them to stay in their own homes for longer and reduces the need for care. We want to increase the range of opportunities our members have to include more trips out with a wider range of activities that will appeal to more people. We will improve the quality of life for many people who live alone and help them to meet new (and sometimes old) friends.

What is Dial-a-Bus?

Dial-a-Bus is a demand responsive transport service operated by the charity "Orkney Disability Forum".

We have

- minibuses with a tail lift for ease of access for users of wheelchairs or walking aids
- smaller vehicles that can take one wheelchair user with passenger
- helpful, knowledgeable, trained drivers.

You need to complete a membership application form and return the form to the office with the £25 membership fee. (£20 if Outer Isles or additional family household member). Your membership needs to be renewed on 1st April each year (a renewal form will be sent to members)

Who can use Dial-a-Bus?

(please read to the end because membership is open to many people...)

- It is available to disabled people of all ages.
- It is available to people with mobility problems, whether temporary or permanent (e.g. a footballer with a broken leg or an elderly person awaiting a knee joint).
- It is available to people with mental health problems
- Also, people with other conditions like arthritis, heart condition, failing eyesight, etc.
- it is also available to anyone of 60 years and over.

How do I use the bus?

Once you are a member you just phone 871515 or pop past our office to make a booking. The booking office is open 9am to1pm and 2pm to 4pm; Monday to Friday, please note the office is closed on a Saturday and Sunday. You can also leave a message on the answer machine.

Once the times and details are agreed, the bus will come to you and collect you at the arranged time.

To help with the scheduling of buses we do ask that you book at least 24 hours in advance and that trips for the weekend must be booked before Friday.

Shopmobility Orkney provides manual and electric wheelchairs and scooters to help clients with a mobility problem to shop in Kirkwall. Equipment can also be hired on short term loan for use in the client's own home or whilst they are on holiday in Orkney. The maximum period for this type of hire is normally 2 weeks. Written medical authority will be required for the electric wheelchairs.


You can pick up your scooter or wheelchair from the office or equipment can be delivered by special arrangement.

On your first visit you will need to fill in a registration form and a member of staff will run through the basics on how the equipment works. Once you have read and signed our terms and conditions and you and the staff are confident that you can handle the equipment - off you go - it's as simple as that.

We also do long term Mobility Scooter hire, but you must have somewhere indoors and dry to store and charge the scooter.

(We do not supply escorts)

The hire rates for Shopmobility equipment are available for Dial-a-bus members and non-Dial-a-bus members.



And, there are more benefits waiting for you!

Only members of Dial-A-Bus who are Orkney residents in possession of a National Entitlement Card and are disabled, have mobility issues or are over 65 may be entitled to participate in the Orkney Islands Council's concessionary travel scheme. This entitles eligible members to 3 free return social or leisure based trips on Dial-A-Bus per calendar month.

This is **not** a booking line. This line can be used when the office is shut for advising of Cancellations, changes of pick up or enquiries if the bus is more than 15 minutes late to pick you up.

When can I use the bus?

Once you are a member you can use the buses normally between 8am and 7pm, 7 days a week (please note there is limited availability on sat and sun). We can provide transport, occasionally, out with these hours, but this needs to be prearranged. You have to fit into the schedule, so the bus might not be able to get there exactly when you want, so there needs to be some flexibility on your part.

What can I use the bus for and what will it cost?


There are 2 fare rates (You pay the driver on the bus) Social and Leisure based trips include, but are not limited to: shopping, visiting friends, attending lunch clubs, physical activities and church.

If you use the bus to go to college, work or make medical journeys such as doctors appointments, dentist or hospital clinics due to funding restrictions we have to charge the higher fare as listed on second column below.

We operate in four distance zones (see attached map for zones)

	Fare for Social & Leisure (S/L) trips	Higher rate fares for Work/Education/ Medical (WEM) trips
Zone A	£4.20	£5.40
Zone B	£6.00	£7.70
Zone C	£8.30	£10.80
Zone D	£10.65	£13.90

You will be charged a fare for the furthest zone travelled. You can check with our staff to see what zone you are in. (Please note trips after 7pm are £1 extra, groups of 4 and over only after 7pm)
