As you get older, or perhaps because you've always lived with a disability, it can be hard to get to those places that really matter to you. If you find yourself at home more than you'd like, you may wish you could see more people in your home.

That's where Volunteer Action can help. We provide a **car scheme** for those who cannot access public transport and can take you to many of the places you would like to go – not just the hospital and doctor's surgery (although they are, of course, offered!) but also shopping, to the hairdresser, to visit friends etc. We also run a **befriending service** of volunteers willing to come out & chat regularly. Our aim is to help improve your well-being and how you define that is largely down to you. We recently introduced an **enhanced referral service** to help you find the help you need.

CAR SERVICE: There is no membership fee and we can take your joining details over the phone when you make a first booking. We usually need 2 working days notice of drives but will consider medical drives at any time. All our drivers are volunteers who get paid 40p per mile (minimum charge £3). This is paid by the passenger directly to the driver in cash on the day. Drivers will wait an hour for a return journey for any purpose other than hospital appointments. For these we allow 2 hours. When travelling further afield (eg to Addenbrookes), drivers will wait even longer. Otherwise, if you need more time you can book 2 journeys. Generally, distance is not a problem.

We have drivers and cars which can take wheelchairs or frame and you are welcome to share the car with other registered passengers (or a carer), subject to our rules on fares applying from each pick-up address.

Dear Barnwellian,

From time to time I am asked what Barnwell Parish Council spends its precept on. I would, therefore, like to take this opportunity to let you know what your Council pays for in the parish:

- * Street lighting
- * Maintenance of Village green trees
- * Mowing and maintenance of the Recreation Field
- * Supplementing the grant from NCC for mowing grass throughout the village
- * Filling the grit bins that are no longer maintained by NCC
- * Public Liability and Employee Insurance
- * NALC subscription
- * Audit fees
- * Grant to St. Andrew's churchyard maintenance
- * Playground maintenance
- * Poppy Wreath
- * Hire of Village Hall for meetings
- * Clerk's salary
- * Printing of newsletters, flyers and posters as required

Our precept for the year 2019/2020 is set at £10,250 which equates to £58.24 per annum for a Band D property.

STREET LIGHTING

We have now obtained the grant for new street lights throughout the village and hope that the replacement work will start soon.

CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND

As I am sure you are all aware, the children's playground is now almost finished but we still have to fence it off for safety reasons before we can officially open. We will advertise the opening date so please keep an eye open for posters throughout the village.

PARKING ON VILLAGE GREEN

Whilst we fully appreciate that parking in Barnwell can sometimes be a real headache, we would like to ask you, if at all possible, not to park on the village green, especially in the winter months when the grass can be severely damaged.

BARNWELL VILLAGE SHOP UPDATE

Following the Extraordinary Parish Council Open Meeting held in May to discuss the future prospects of the Barnwell Village Shop, 16 volunteers expressed an interest in establishing a working group and have met three times. They have formed the Barnwell Village Shop Community Group with the purposes laid out below. Jay has been in dialogue with the group and is supportive of its work and aims.

The purpose of the Barnwell Village Shop Community Group is to investigate the feasibility to support, develop and sustain a community facility providing goods and services for the people of Barnwell and neighbouring villages.

The Group will:

Work in parallel with Jay and Vicky as they seek to cease running the village shop and Post Office.

Carry out a village survey and other research to assess the demand and need for local goods and services.

Assess the options to continue to support, or run, a community led facility.

Complete a business plan including an appropriate legal structure and funding solutions if a viable venture is identified.

At this exploratory stage, the Barnwell Village Shop Community Group will be run by the committee as an unincorporated association and as an unincorporated body will not enter into any contracts or financial arrangements unless expressly agreed by all members of the committee and minuted as such.

A survey is expected to be distributed to those in Barnwell and the neighbouring villages shortly and encourage everyone to provide feedback.
