HOLIDAY CARAVAN AT HINDERWELL NEAR WHITBY, NORTH YORKSHIRE

















A comfortable and well equipped caravan offering relaxing accommodation for a holiday or a short break in this beautiful corner of North Yorkshire.

Located in a quiet village, the location offers a peaceful retreat yet there are plenty of activities and things to do and see on the doorstep or within a short distance.

Ideal for those who enjoy walking, a bit of history or just enjoying the spectacular scenery of this section of the coastline. There is something for everyone within easy reach and yet you can leave it all behind and retreat to your bolt hole.

The caravan is sited at The Badger Hounds site which is a quiet site behind the Badger Hounds public house on High Street, Hinderwell, North Yorkshire. There are only five other caravans on the site so you will only see a few people quietly coming and going. Parking is available within a few yards of the caravan.

The caravan, a Willerby Herald, is very well equipped with everything you should need and more. It has two bedrooms, one double and one twin, but will sleep 5/6 by making up a double bed in the lounge area if needed.

The kitchen is fully equipped with cooker, oven, fridge, microwave, toaster, kettle and all the pots and pans, crockery and cutlery you will need.

There is a separate lounge area with comfortable seating and which has TV, DVD and CD player and gas fire should you need it.

The bathroom consists of a toilet, sink and shower. All hot water is supplied via the boiler.

Outside there is a spacious decking area to the front of the caravan with patio table and chairs and which faces West enabling you to enjoy the afternoon and evening sun. A perfect place for you to eat out or enjoy a glass of wine on those sunny summer evenings.

The village of Hinderwell offers a P.O, Newsagents, Church, Garage, Hairdressers, Fish & chips, Bistro, a Butchers shop which also sells eggs and veg, and 2 Pubs, both of which serve food. All of these are within a few minutes walk of the site. A further 5 minute drive out of the village towards Staithes there is a Co-op. For big supermarkets, Whitby or Saltburn are nearby.

A regular bus service runs right outside the site to Whitby in the south and Saltburn and beyond to the north.

What to do and where to go.

Staithes.

Picturesque coastal village with historic links to Captain James Cook. Within walking distance or 5 minutes by car.

Runswick Bay.

Clean beach with plenty of space. Again within walking distance or by car.

The Cleveland Way.

Clifftop footpath with stunning coastal views. Within walking distance.

Port Mulgrave.

Port is now gone but popular with fossil hunters on what is known as the Jurassic Coast. Within 15 minutes walk.

The surrounding coastal villages can be quite hilly in places so please consider this. Whitby.

8 miles by car or bus. Abbey, boat pleasure trips, fishing trips, shopping, historic town. Everything you need from a seaside town. Supposedly where Dracula first came ashore as a wolf!

North Yorkshire Moors Steam Railway.

The nostalgia of the Steam train era. Trains run between Whitby and Pickering with stops in between. Each station on the route is restored to a different decade. Travel the whole route or hop on and off as you wish.

Grossmont.

N Y Moors village. Home of the repair yards for the trains. A stop on the NYM Railway.

Goathland

N Y Moors village, used in the popular TV series 'Heartbeat' where it was renamed 'Aidensfield'. Also a stop on the NYM Railway where the station was used in the Harry Potter films.

North Yorkshire moors park

The surrounding area is covered in vast moorland and plenty of footpaths to keep you walking for hours or take your car and explore the small roads leading into small hidden villages.
