HUNTERIAN ART GALLERY, GLASGOW – A PRIVATE VISIT TO THE PERMANENT ART COLLECTION AND THE TEMPORARY EXHIBITION "ART OF POWER – MASTERPIECES OF THE BUTE COLLECTION" MONDAY 23 OCTOBER 2017

The Hunterian Art Gallery will have a special opening on a Monday for this private visit for EDFAS members to their "Art of Power" exhibition. The curator and author of the catalogue, Dr Peter Black, will talk to us about these rarely seen masterpieces collected by John Stuart, Third Earl of Bute (1713-1792). This exhibition includes European and British masterpieces, from Jan Steen, Jacob van Ruisdael, Jan Brueghel I, Anthony Van Dyck, Joshua Reynolds. Claude Lorrain and Allan Ramsay, many of which have not been on public display in over a century. The main Gallery will also be open for us to view their distinguished permanent collection, which ranges from Rubens and Rembrandt to the Scottish Colourists, Glasgow Boys and the world's largest permanent display of the work of James McNeill Whistler.

Tickets include entry to the Hunterian Art Gallery, the Art of Power Exhibition and a light lunch in the University. There will be two groups of 25, at 11.00 am and 12 noon. Tickets at £20 per head, offered to members only at this stage, will be issued by ballot after 6th October. Members will travel independently to Glasgow; those arriving by train should be able to share taxis to the University. Applications by post to:
