Q 8 You open 1♠ and Responder bids 2♠.
What does that mean?

Q 9 You open 1♠ and Responder bids 3♠.
What does that mean?

Q 10 Define the term “support for partner’s suit”

A 2 You need to have 4+ cards in the Heart suit and 12 – 19 HCP's

A1 When Responder makes a limit bid he shows his HCP count within a narrow range. e.g.

Opener	Responder
1♥	2♥
(6-9 HCPs + 4 card support in hearts)	
1♥	1NT
(6-9 HCPs No 4-card support in hearts)	

A 4 Bid the Clubs first – bid the lower of two 4 card suits of the same rank.

A 3 Diamonds – bid your longest suit first.

A 6 Spades. With two 5 card suits, bid with the higher ranking suit first.

A 5 Hearts. With two 4 card suits of different rank, bid the major suit first.

A 8 Responder has 4+ cards in the Spades suit.
His point range is 6 – 9 HCP.

A7 You know that the partnership holds a total of 25+ HCP and that is enough for game. You also know that you have a FIT in Spades.
Bid 4♠

A10 You are looking for an 8 card FIT. You can support your partner's bid suit when the partnerships has 8+ cards in the suit. If partner has promised 4 cards and you have 4 then you have a fit and can support.

A 9 Partner has 4+ cards in Spades and 10 – 12 HCP.
