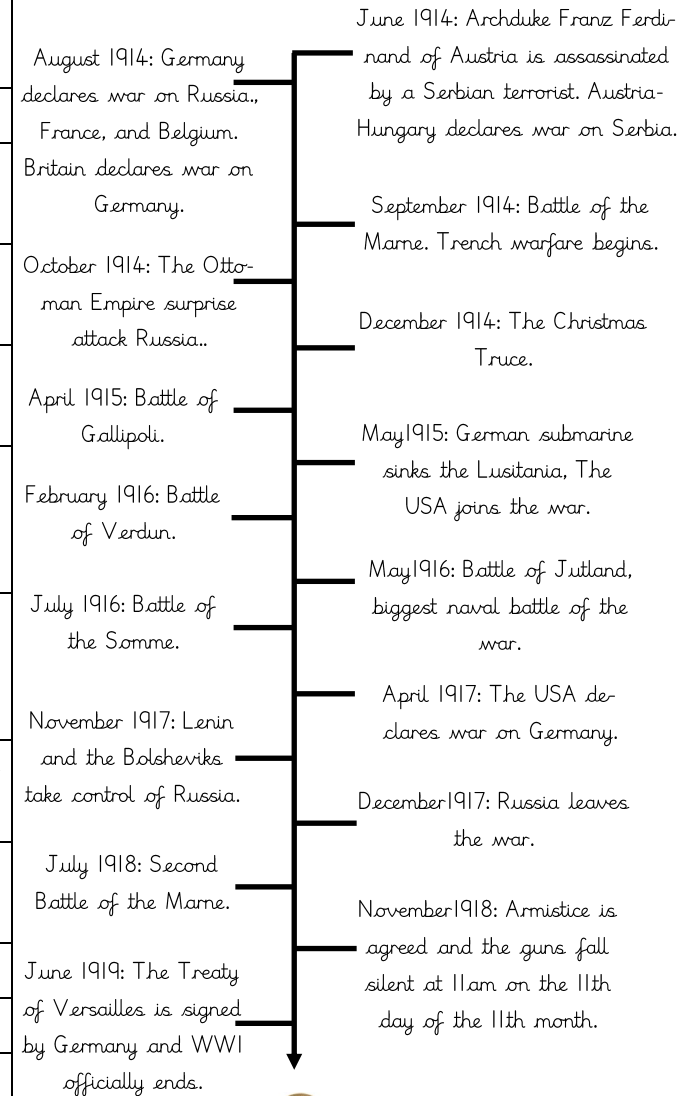


# World War One (WWI)



Key Vocabulary	
World War	A war fought by countries all around their world, and their respective Empires.
Triple Entente	The alliance between Britain, Russia, and France.
Triple Alliance	The alliance between Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy.
Allied Powers	Britain, France, Russia, Italy, Japan, and the United States.
Central Powers	Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria, and the Ottoman Empire.
Western Front	A long series of trench lines from the North Sea to the Swiss border where most of the fighting in Europe took place.
Trench	Long ditches dug into the ground where soldiers lived on the Western Front, designed to keep the soldiers safe from harm.
Schlieffen Plan	The German plan to defeat France quickly at the start of the war.
Treaty of Versailles	The Treaty forced upon the Central Powers at the end of the war.
Infantry	Foot soldiers.
Cavalry	Soldiers on horseback.
Suffragette	A group of women who fought for Votes for Women as part of the Women's Social and Political Union (WSPU).
Suffragist	A group of women who fought for Votes for Women as part of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies (NUWSS).

### When was WWI?

World War One took place from 28th July 1914 to 11th November 1918.

### Who was Archduke Franz Ferdinand?

He was the heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary and was assassinated on the 28th June 1914, causing WWI.

### How were women involved in WWI?

Women took over many of the jobs men left when they went to fight on the Front. Women worked in the fields, in offices, even in munitions factories. Their work helped them gain support for their campaign for the Vote.
