iii) Grant request

The Parish Council had received an application from Forest Hill Baby and Toddler Group with an update on the current running of the group. The request was for a possible contribution towards their total annual running costs of approx. £700 for the weekly hire of the village hall plus heating costs.

The Council **RESOLVED** unanimously to pay the full £700 running costs. This will be split into two payments £350 for the first six months, after 6 months if the local attending numbers remain the same or higher the remaining £350 will be paid. If, however, the numbers have declined then the council reserves the right to review the final payment.

iv) 2nd quarter internal check and budget comparison – documents previously circulated.

The Council **RESOLVED** to agree the checks and budget comparison. Duly signed by the Internal Controller.

v) Draft budget for 2022/23.

The Council discussed the draft budget with three suggested minor alterations. The final budget will be presented at the next meeting for authorisation.

i) The new allotment lease has been received. There are now 2 original leases to be taken to the bank for safe storage.

97. BUS SERVICE and TRANSPORT

Cllr Leeding reported that the Otmoor Flyer would continue to run while funds allow. The no 85 bus is running, usually with no passengers on board. Cllr Leeding had recently attended a meeting of the Parish Transport Representatives group (PTR).

The Chair thanked Cllr Leeding for all his work on the bus and transport services to the village.

98. VILLAGE and PARISH MATTERS

i) Grass cutting – update.

The Council were pleased with the service provided by Green Scythe this year. The number and areas of cuts will be reviewed before next year's cutting season.

- **ii)** Installation of car charging point outside the village hall The Council discussed the possibilities but **RESOLVED** to agree to postpone the idea for the immediate future.
- iii) Installation of Shotover notice board and recreation ground gate Four local Handyman/Maintenance providers had been approached for quotes. Only one had replied with a quote. Two could not take on the work and one did not reply. Due to the amount of money involved the Chair agreed to the quote from Subbi The Handyman of:

£250 to remove the existing notice board and install the replacement. £365 to install the new gate in the recreation ground.

The Shotover notice board has been installed and a new gate has been ordered.

iv) There was a concern on the activity of vehicles entering Minchin Court.

Action: Clerk to write to New College requesting an update on the current lease holders of the property.

99. VILLAGE HALL

i) Managing Trustees finances report – previously circulated.

Reserves as at 2 December 2021; Current Account £3,658.43. Deposit Account 2,887.83. Total £6,546.26.

The Trustees thank the Parish Council for agreeing to award a grant towards the decorating and replacement windows. Rentals are slowly climbing back towards pre-Covid levels but the Keep-fit/Health classes have not returned.

The Trustees are planning a 'Village get-together' tea in the hall on the afternoon of Saturday 21 November, as an opportunity for new people to the village to meet each other.

100. RECREATION GROUND

i) Proposed new project and rewilding (since Aug 2021 min 2021/60vi). – to receive an update.

The Chair updated Cuncillors; 200 freely given saplings are due to arrive around mid November. He has received a quote of £450 to plant the trees. There will be a need for the installation of a water supply in the spring.

ii) Ground repairs to cricket net area

Cllr Hobins reported that the bowling area has become unfit for purpose. He will cover the area with top soil and plant grass seed.

Action: Cllr Hobbins

101. CEMETERY

i) Burials for non-residents

Clerk has receveived confirmation that it is a fairly normal practice for a Parish Council to either refuse to bury non-residents or to charge double of even triple fees.

The Council **RESOLVED** to agreed to review any such application on a case by case basis.

ii) Measurements of headstones

It was suggested that the measurement of memorial headstones currently quoted in the Cemetery procedures document was updated to the standard measurements used by memorial stone masons.

The Council **RESOLVED** to agree to the following:

Headstone - height 27" x width 23" x depth 3"

Base - width 24" x depth 12" x height 1"

Foundation base – width 33" x depth 18" x height 1"

iii) Exclusive Right of Burial and privacy notice

The Council **RESOLVED** to agree that the purchaser of a grave space should be issued with a confirmation of the Exclusive Rights of Burial to that plot, for a fixed period of 99 years. Raising it from the current period of 50 years. Each plot will be double dug, unless specifically requested by the grave purchaser.

Action: Clerk to update the procedure document with the details of all of the above.

102. ALLOTMENTS

There was no report.

103. COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESILIENCE PLAN

Cllr Massey had received one response to the appeal for volunteer residents to be listed as a responder in document.

Action: Cllr Massey will finalise the document.

104. Land North of Bayswater Brook

The Chair reported that a developer has presented an outline plan for the development.

Action: Clir Waite Brown will continue to update the council on the proposed development.

105. A safer pace, safer place campaign

The Chair introduced a project from OCC to reduce all the urban 30mph speed limits to 20mph.

The Council **RESOLVED** unanimously to back the proposal.

Action: Cllr Waite Brown to reply to OCC.

106. OALC/NALC

i) OALC newsletter - previously circulated.

Cllr Leeding has retired from his position with NALC. He will remain with OALC.

On behalf of the Parish Council, the Chair thanked Cllr Leeding for his dedication to NALC for 26 years.

The Council **RESOLVED** unanimously to agree the work and time Cllr Leeding gives to the Parish Council is much appreciated.
