#### A WORRYING TREND

Residents of both Cubert and Holywell Bay have reported the use, by children (under 18's), using non-motorised skateboards, roller skates and scooters on the public roads and pavements within Cubert Parish. This is taking place during daylight hours, at dusk and late into the evening. This renders the riders at risk of not being seen easily, or, in the case of darkness, not being seen at all. They are also using the whole road and not just the left side in the direction of travel and this is particularly dangerous around bends. Further concern is the activity of sitting on a skateboard and travelling down the road at low level making the rider well hidden from other road and pavement users.

This trend is not happening every day, but every time this behaviour occurs it could lead to an accident. How much control to steer and brake does each individual child have in order to avoid an accident on the public road or pavement?

It has been observed, several times, that older children skateboard to and from the skate park into Cubert village on the wrong side of the road in daylight and in the dusk / dark.

The street lighting in any area of the Cubert Parish does not assist the visibility of any riders at night. They are still rendered virtually invisible or at best as shadows.

With adult supervision, the risks of these activities during the daylight hours may be lowered. However, should children be put a risk amongst motorised vehicles? You may state at this point "the driver of the motorized vehicle should be hazard aware at any time and should be able to stop". You may also be of the opinion that it would be the driver's fault for any accident. However, if the motorised vehicle stops but the child on the non-motorised transport cannot stop or 'steer' away then they would hit the stationary motorised vehicle.

You may also ask...."What has it got to do with you?!"

It is to do with my personal experience and the fact that no matter whose fault, an accident will affect everyone concerned......

Well over 20 years ago I was witness to a fatal accident. I was at a bus stop and on the opposite side of the road stood a boy. When the bus appeared, the boy ran back to his house and (as I found out afterwards) told his brother the bus was coming. He then ran back towards the road to get to the bus stop and forgot to stop and look. The boy ran straight into the side of the vehicle just passing his gateway. He was pushed backwards and hit his head on the kerb.

Many weeks later I attended court as a witness to state the facts. I can never forget the state of the driver as well as the parents of the boy. The driver had not worked since the accident and was clearly still very distressed even though, with my evidence along with bus passengers, he was completely exonerated.

I have written this in order to bring it to the attention of everyone to help mitigate the risk of an accident in our parish, concerning children on non-motorised transport such as skateboards, roller skates and scooters. I do not want to be either a witness to, or hear about, an accident or even be involved through no fault of my own and then experience the impact on life.

I do not want to stop children enjoying themselves but there are plenty of safe places to carry out these activities other than public roads.

#### **BIRD NOTES**

Results of the Big Garden Birdwatch held on the 29th/30th/31st January, locally showed large numbers of **Goldfinches**. Indeed a friend in Staffordshire had similar returns. Other species Included Starlings and House Sparrows. I myself, recorded 8 species; some regular species I normally see, didn't show on the day. As usual Greenfinches were very scarce. Clive Pope noted 12 species including Long-tailed Tits and Blackcaps. The RSPB praised "the power of nature to uplift" after interest in the Birdwatch rose 85% this year.

Some rare birds would be more common if it were not for human interference with habitats, but others have benefitted, a study has revealed. Ten species including Golden Eagles and **Greenshanks** may have become widespread if it were not for deforestation of wetlands. But the RSPB says some common birds such as Turtle Doves and Grey Partridges would be rarer without agriculture. On the 30th January, two Swans were confirmed with bird (avian) flu at Falmouth. Locals were told to avoid any contact.

Peregrine Falcons reared chicks in at least 4 National Trust places last year. The sites included Corfe Castle in Dorset. In the High Peak Moors, Derbyshire, 8 chicks were discovered, doubling their numbers since 2012.

A tagged White-tailed Eagle flew 3,000 miles in 17 months before returning to the Isle of Wight.

Dave and Sharon Smith had a Stonechat in their garden on 24th January; very unusual to see one come in so far from the coastline. I have seen them on gorse bushes on Cubert Common.

Bob Eardley had a Blackcap by his feeders on 6th February, I had one in my garden on 7<sup>th</sup> February. Geoff May recorded Coal Tits on 9th February, he had seen them some time before. I was pleased to see the beautiful Long-tailed Tits on my feeders on 5th February.

A **Northern Mockingbird** was seen in Exmouth, Devon making it only the second sighting of this species in the UK ever. The bird is normally resident in parts of the USA and Mexico. The bird's name is a

reference to its mimicry of other birds. Unfortunately, avid bird watchers travelled long istances to see it, and some were fined. RODNEY PHILLIPS







We need to address the situation urgently because we have a much bigger project in hand for the coming year.

The extension, completed a couple of years ago, has proved invaluable, but too small. A planning application is currently awaiting decision for two new large block-built storage rooms in the rear car park. Coupled with that, the metal portacabin that was in the corner of the car park has collapsed. This was being used to house the village Christmas lights and associated equipment, all of which is solely for parish fundraising events. 


#### **CNDP QUESTIONNAIRE**

The beginning of the year has seen some inspiring TV films, bringing into our homes a sense of the real damage being caused around the world to the natural environment, because of pollution, over development and climate change. David Attenborough's 'A Perfect Planet' was one of these series, and another was Simon Reeves looking back over his 15 years of travel to many parts of the world, visiting rain forests, islands and wildernesses and showing both the reasons for despair and the reasons for hope in the way people, communities and governments are responding to the way the world is changing. Here in Cornwall, a report has been published following collaboration between the Cornwall Wildlife Trust, Cornwall Council and Exeter University, called 'State of Nature Cornwall 2020'. It shows that since the 1980's in Cornwall, nearly half the land mammals and breeding birds have declined and three fifths of butterflies are found in fewer places. There are several reasons for this, partly to do with the increased development associated with population increase – in Cornwall an increase of 12% since 2002, land use and farming practices – there has been a 30% decline in farmland bird species since 1994, and sea pollution affecting marine life, especially plastic and discarded netting. In Cornwall in 2019, 80,000 kilos of rubbish were removed from Cornish beaches, equivalent to 67 small cars! There is also good news in the report. Cornwall Wildlife Trust now has more than 17,000 members, demonstrating the rise in interest and concern for the natural world, and in a national survey it was found that 75% of people value Nature more since the Covid-19 epidemic. Wildlife can recover if given the right opportunity, and the return of Chough to Cornwall in recent years has been a success story, also locally extinct species such as Water Vole, Cirl Bunting and Beavers are being reintroduced successfully. Other good news is that a third of our inshore waters now lie within a Marine Protected Area, and during the year of Lockdown our seal population has had time to relax and enjoy a peaceful life undisturbed by humans. All this tells us that we do not have to feel helpless in the face of huge problems such as climate change, polluting industry and runaway plastic. As individuals we can make sure we consume less and recycle more. We can make space for nature in our gardens, public spaces and on our farmland, and as voters we can lobby our councils and MPs to take

environmental issues seriously and keep political promises made for a Green Recovery.

My New Year resolution was to join the Cornwall Wildlife Trust and help to support the conservation work being done all around me, and I have found it such a rewarding thing to do! I was amazed to find there are 57 Nature Reserves in our county, run by CWT, ranging from one acre to nearly three hundred acres, and twenty of these are in Mid-Cornwall. There is also a very good magazine published three times a year, chances to volunteer on many different projects, and for families, special resources for children. Finally, we have the prospect of the G7 conference coming to Cornwall in June, when climate change will be on the agenda. Let's hope that those visiting politicians will be inspired by our beautiful county to really commit to a Green Recovery from the pandemic, which will clean up our planet and help to make sustainable communities where all life can flourish. Thank you for your time and concern, in small ways we can make change happen!

I hope by the time you read this article the dreadful rain and high winds that are pounding my window will have been replaced by sunshine and gentle breezes. Wishful thinking? We need to see daffodils and spring flowers to bring some cheer to our village. Lock down, we hope, will have been eased if only a little. Some of you will have already received your vaccination and be feeling a little more confident about going out and about when the time comes. It has been tough but I have been heartened, as I look back over the reports of last year, to see that we have not been inactive and managed to support the community and each other. Here are some highlights.

Review of 2020: March saw our last full meeting, although we didn't know it at the time. It started the year for WI with the election of president, Janis Ross, appointed for another year. It also saw the reading of the financial statement. During the social part of the meeting Covid 19 was very much in our thoughts, but we did not realise how much it would rule our lives. By April we were in deep lockdown so no meeting or even a Parish Magazine to report in. The May Parish Magazine was reduced in size but did include information about the plans for Operation Hedgehog, the Allsop Cup competition, we had entered.

The June report was filled with the planned activities for VE Day following the partial easing of lock down that had taken place in May. Ultimately, our grand plans for the week running up to VE Day had to be greatly reduced because of covid restrictions. However, through a joint effort between the village and Crantock Knits Poppies we managed to celebrate by decorating the outside of the Memorial Hall and the green, giving our new 'Tommy' pride of place. By July many members had really got into their stride and reports came in about how daily life had changed. Some were involved in shopping and collecting prescriptions for neighbours, others painting and exercising more, including wild water swimming. Walking became more popular than ever, particularly over the now deserted, beautiful coastal path with more flowers and wildlife than had been seen before. Sewing featured greatly and items such as Corona quilts and Covid cushions appeared in abundance, but did not prevent the mass production of masks. Baking was also going on at break-neck speed. To try to communicate with our members in as many ways as possible, the Crantock WI Facebook page was born. Crantock Operation Hedgehog also had its own page so information collected could be shared with WI members and those who lived in the village and beyond. We were hopeful in August that things would soon be getting back to normal and plans started to be made for future face to face meetings.

A feature about us appeared in *My WI* magazine, as no other WI in the land had quite the display that we had.

The winter months saw full lockdown again. In January the WI book group members experienced their first meeting on Zoom which was a great success. We thoroughly enjoyed being able to discuss our book of the month and catch up with friends as well. We will continue to meet in this way until we are allowed to resume meeting in person as a group.

**Forthcoming events:** Although November is a long way away, poppies for the next display (which promises to be even more spectacular) are being knitted. Wool is in a box at Salli Blackford's gate for those who would like to join the many knitters in the area and around the country. We featured in Beauty and Craft, a national Magazine, and the NFWI has selected the article about our poppy display to be included in a publication to mark the 100 year anniversary of the Royal British Legion.

The March committee and full meeting are planned to take place via zoom. If anyone would like to be included in this zoom meeting and hasn't already said so, please let me know. For those members not able to communicate in this way, information from the meeting will be provided later. March is the month when we vote for the Crantock WI President. This year, procedures are a little different. If you've not already done so, please register your vote by emailing, phoning or posting to Salli Blackford (even if you are able to zoom at the meeting) **before the 9<sup>th</sup> of March**. We are all missing the company and friendship of our meetings. As a reminder of better times, Sue Stevens and Marie Hedge put together goody bags of interesting things including a lavender bag kit, puzzle, local nibbles and more along with our monthly WI magazine. The response from members was amazing! A big thank you to Sue and Marie for 'Spreading the Love'. The competition this month is 'Spring'. It could be a photo taken while out walking, a painting or sketch, a short story about the subject or a favourite Spring poem. Either post on the WI Facebook page or email to Linda Hallwood. The top three will appear in next month's Parish Magazine.
