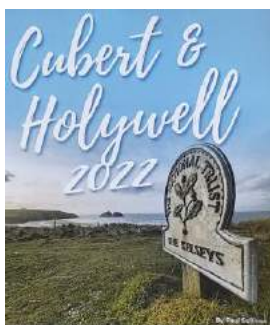

Numbers of Hen Harriers have been increasing at the "Vile" Rhosili, Swansea in recent years. After the 2nd World War as farming modernised, many of the hedges were lost. Since 2017 the National Trust has been working to restore them and provide space for wildlife. Also they are leaving between 10 and 20% of the Vile's arable fields fallow. Hen Harriers are top predators and their presence is a good indicator of a healthy landscape.



HEN HARRIER

Newquay Zoo is well worth a visit for the species of birds there. Plumed Whistling Ducks which come from North and East Australia are found on the lake, also Brown Pelicans from the Pacific coast of the Americas mainly, also the Atlantic coast from Northern USA to North Brazil. Quite striking are the Black-necked Swans. In the walk through aviary you can see many species including ground dwelling Roul-Roul.



MEADOW PIPIT

On the 22nd October Sharon Smith watched a Meadow Pipit in her garden for some time, possibly from the fields nearby.

8 Little Egrets were seen on the Gannel Estuary by Val and Bob Eardley, also on the 22nd October. I think this equals the record number seen there for some years.

A very rare bird has been found dead in a garden. The golden White's Thrush is thought to have hit a window of a house in Weymouth, Dorset. The species have not been seen in the county for 100 years. Portland Bill Bird Observatory warden said, "They come from Russia



and it's really exciting to get it here." Dave and Sharon Smith had a Meadow Pipit in their garden again on 31st October. It seems to favour this spot

Hamnet is a fictional tale of Shakespeare's family and is never referred by his name. The story alternates between 1596 when Hamnet dies aged 11 and Agnes's early life and marriage.

The death of their only son leaves the family not only the family bereft but the reader too, very sad but worth a read. The group would recommend it.

PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT 2022/23 – To decide Precept: RESOLVED unanimously: To increase the Precept to £29000 for the year 2022/23. This represents an increase on a Band D property of just over 1p per week when compared to 2020/21 (The last time the Parish Council charged a precept).

CUBERT TOILET REFURBISHMENT

It was decided to defer consideration until further negotiations have taken place with the contractor.

FULL SUPPORT SWING – To resolve on acceptance of a quote.

Resolved to accept the Caledonia Quote with the proviso that they can cater for a 2 year old.

ANY OTHER RELEVANT BUSINESS NOT REQUIRING DECISIONS AT THIS MEETING:

Cllr. D. Hopkinson raised the issue of the condition of the I bars on Chynowen Lane. Cllr. R.L.B Spencer volunteered to re-instate the I bars. Cllr. G. Rowe spoke about bramble overgrowth at the traffic calming by the School. It was decided to report this in to Highways. He also reported parishioner concerns over the trees overhanging graves in the cemetery.

Cllr. W.Caff indicated that he should be in a position to arrange remedial works shortly.

LITTER BINS

If you are not passing a Dog Waste bin - Please consider taking your dog waste home with you and disposing of it in your general waste. You might want to consider using a Dicky Dog Waste Bag in future? Domestic waste should never be placed in litter bins. Please use the Cornwall Council regular collection service.

As the evenings are now drawing in, when walking, please dress appropriately to be seen and face oncoming traffic.

PARISH PRECEPT ELEMENT OF COUNCIL TAX BILL 2022/23

There will appear to be a significant increase on the parish precept part of the annual council tax charge for 2022/23. The charge will be in the region of £51.82 for a "D" Band property. This charge will be shown as a £51.82 increase from the "£0" rate of 2021/22, as the Parish Council was able to provide a complete COVID 19 precept holiday, using reserves, savings, and grants, for this current year. The previous Cubert Parish precept charge for a "D" Band property in 2020/21 was £51.26 (itself a decrease of 1.5% on the previous year) and the 2022/23 charge covers only the anticipated expenditure for year 2022/23. It does not include any repayment charge for the COVID 19 precept holiday of 2021/22.

CNDP UPDATE



Looking back twelve months the Cubert NDP Steering Group were deciding “to review each of the six priority areas identified in the initial survey and establishing the practical options available.”

I feel that the exhibition held on the 13th of November represented the culmination of that review and afforded the residents of Cubert the opportunity to have oversight of the results and provide informed comment for us to take into the next stage of the process; the composition of a draft NDP document.

During the afternoon of the exhibition, I felt that there was a profound atmosphere of community within the hall that was generated by the attendees through their interaction with both the Steering Group and each other. It was also pleasing to see the demographic cross section of those attending that, I suppose, represented both the past and present in terms of the development of the Parish together with those who represent the future.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Steering Group for the time and effort that they put into the delivery of the exhibition and, on their behalf, thank everyone who took the time to come along and make such a positive contribution to the event.

December will see the Steering Group focusing on the analysis of the latest information that we have acquired and as we move into another new year the focus will turn to the plan itself.

The “information collection” phase has concluded but that does not preclude anyone from submitting their views or suggestions.

After all the talking, protesting and speech-making, COP 26 has finished and with perhaps more to celebrate than was expected. There can be little doubt that the numbers of people who turned up to demonstrate, the young climate protesters and the First Nation people who travelled long distances to make their voices heard, all contributed towards turning the tide of the general intentions of national governments toward acknowledging the urgency and importance of making world-changing decisions. The agreement between America and China, to drastically reduce methane emissions was a massive step, as long as they continue to work together and keep their promises. Likewise, the agreement to 'phase down' coal production across the world is heartening, even if it is not as radical as was hoped. And the commitment to finally address the issues of deforestation and the proper funding of vulnerable small nations has got to be a step in the right direction.

Sadly, the statistics don't stand still, and the ability to keep global warming to 1.5C by the end of the century is still very challenging, with predictions that it is on course to rise to 2.7C by then. We must hope that the small progress made at Glasgow this year will be followed up by the increasing urgency and ability of countries to improve their commitments, because 2.7C would mean catastrophic loss of life, both human and animal as well as large scale damage to oceans and landscapes across the world.

Meanwhile, if governments are finding it hard to implement changes, on a smaller scale, cities across the world are leading the way on the climate crisis. Sadiq Khan, the Mayor of London, has said that more than two thirds of the C40 cities are on course to either meet their promises for net zero emissions made at the Paris agreement, or have exceeded them. Last week he was elected as the new chair of the C40 cities, which is a group of 97 city mayors from around the world, all working to take action on the climate crisis. It was interesting to see the measures taken by Glasgow towards renewable energy with the city buses all running on electric motors, and happily, Glasgow is not the only city to have installed electric public transport, especially in Europe.

And finally, Tim Peake, our own British astronaut, has spoken about his time on the International Space Station and how deeply it has influenced his appreciation of the beauty and fragility of Planet Earth. One of his responses has been to join 57 million Scouts across the world making a #Promise to the Planet, with each Scout making a commitment to take positive action, however small, to create a better future for us all.

Making fresh commitments towards a better future is something we can all do, and one of the recommended ways of reducing emissions is to eat less meat. This does not have to be going all the way and becoming vegan, although that is a great ideal to aspire to. Just having one meal a week without meat is good, and more is even better. There are now so many recipes and ready meals which are plant-based rather than animal based, it is getting much easier

to prepare and buy interesting, nourishing and exciting vegetarian food. As always it is the mass produced animal products which cause the most harm, like clearing forests to plant soya to feed intensive beef production, and the grim and inhumane intensive production of chicken. Buying meat that has been locally produced in traditional ways not only supports local farmers, but provides healthier food and better living conditions for the animals. It might be more expensive, but if it is eaten less often, prices are balanced out and if you are a meat eater, you get to enjoy a really high quality product. A catchphrase for this is Use Your LOAF – Local, Organic and Animal Friendly. All worth considering if you haven't already!

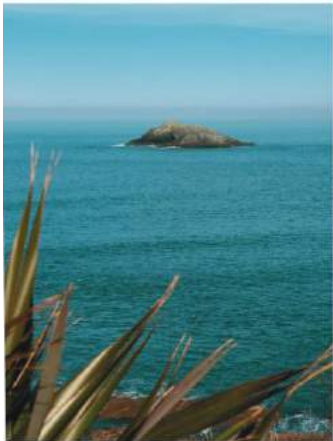

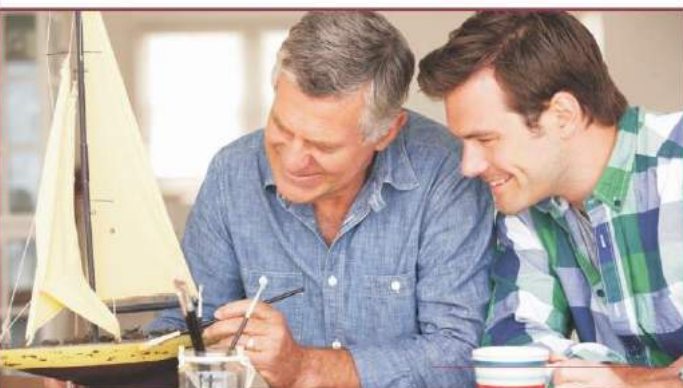
