





Friday assemblies have taken place ( within Key Stages) for the presentation of Star of The Week awards and hopefully it won't be too long before parents and carers will invited in to share the celebrations.

Key Stage One had a visit form a theatre group who performed 'The Kiss That Missed'. Everyone enjoyed the play and the performers commented on the behaviour of the children saying that they were a credit to the school and were one of the best audiences they had had.

The behaviour and sportsmanship of our pupils has been praised at sporting events attended this term at Treviglas and Tretherras. In the Key Stage One Football Festival, Cubert won every match, our rugby players just missed out on qualifying for the next round at Treviglas, and the netballers came third against teams from across St Austell. 


#### Jubilee Celebrations Homemade Beer and Wine Competition 2nd June 2022

I hope by now you've stopped feeding the birds in your garden as there is enough natural food for them. I realise that everybody likes to see the birds, but by now they are nesting and they will forage plenty of food for themselves. Remember use a gentle detergent to clean your feeders and put away for nect winter. A Crested Caracara (Bird of Prey) flew off from London Zoo in March and was spotted 8 days later on 23<sup>rd</sup> March at Barnes Common 11 miles from the Zoo. They are well equipped for surviving in an urban environment as they are scavengers eating carrion, insects and grubs. In 1965 a male Golden Eagle called 'Goldie' fled from the Zoo for 12 dyas before being caught. The Caracara escaped by flying off during training.

Birds are laying their eggs 4 weeks earlier than a century ago due to climate change boffins in Chicago found.

'Albie' the Albatross thought to be living in the Northern Hemisphere was seen on the 30<sup>th</sup> March flying off the UK coast at Bridlington, East Yorks. by R.S.P.B. helpers. The South Atlantic bird has lived in Europe since 2014 after getting lost. His U.K. visits in 2017, 2020 and 2021 drew thousands of bird watchers including T.V.'s Bill Oddie. This huge seabird can live until they are 70 and said to fly for years without landing, and can fly hundreds of miles a day due to their vast wing span.



At the end of March Nicola Phillips had two Bramblings in her garden, one male and one female.

A Pair of eagles in Loch Garton nature reserve in the Cairngorms, Scotland are being filmed for the first time by a camera hidden in a stick. The two eggs were due to hatch about mid April.

Tim Hodder reports that the Ravens nesting on cliffs b=nearby have 3 chicks and are busy feeding them; also that with the Choughs nearby that one is obviously sitting with the other one regularly visiting the nest. Wheatear are being seen regularly. On the 31<sup>st</sup> March he saw a Gannet over the sea..

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> March Ben Hosking had 2 Pied Wagtails in his garden.

Brian Osborne is very successful with a bird nesting box in his garden; with Blue Tits using it again this year.



#### CRANTOCK W.I.

#### WI press Report May 2022

The April meeting was well attended and, although there was much to discuss, there was also plenty of time to relax, enjoy the speakers' interesting presentation and the company of other members. We were pleased to receive our Crantock WI programme for 2022-23 produced after many hours of hard work by Secretary Ann Evans.

President Linda Hallwood welcomed Colleen Bright as a new member of the committee.

Colleen will initially be looking after the monthly competition and book table as well as getting involved in the general business of the committee.

Secretary Ann Evans brought to our attention the various raffle tickets, 2023 diaries and other items including code of



conduct on the display table. Events Organisers Lynne Wilson and Rosie Taylor ran through the up and coming events. Coffee, Cake and Chat morning takes place on 19th April at Treago, the trip to Launceston, Music Hall evening on 28th May and the Thursday morning silver screen film viewing were some of the events on the list. Lynne Wilson told us about a recent visit to the Energy Recovery Centre and has written the following report;

VISIT TO THE CORNWALL ENERGY RECOVERY CENTRE (CERC) TUESDAY MARCH 2022

Thirteen of us arrived at the Centre in what appeared to be a very quiet processing plant near St Denis to learn more about what happens to Cornwall's general (black bag) waste. We were split into two groups - one group had the 'talk' first and the other the 'tour'. Our talk was given by a very enthusiastic member of SUEZ staff - Sarah - who explained the 30 year contract between Cornwall Council and SUEZ - which has another 15 years to run. The Plant became fully operational in 2017 and provides enough power for the plant to be self sufficient and provide electricity to 21,000 homes. Sarah explained the process of producing the electricity from the delivery of Cornwalls black bag waste through to the by-product (ash) which is turned into road surface material and building blocks amongst others. We then had to get kitted up in a hi-vis vest, visor, gloves and earphones for the next part of the visit - the tour of the facility. We saw lorries arriving (around 50 - 70 per day) and offloading into the 'bunker' where a giant claw lifts and separates the rubbish to make burning more efficient. The area is also deodorised - there is obviously a smell but its not overpowering (although there is a bit of a lingering smell on clothes - had to put everything in the washing machine when I got home!) There is two of everything to allow for shutdown for maintenance purposes. We saw the huge stacks (120 metres tall) and when maintenance is carried out the operative has to climb up inside the stack. There is a viewing platform at the top and Amy (our guide) said there must be a marvellous view from there - although she hasn't had the courage to see for herself! Another plant deals with Cornwalls recycling (not very impressive at 38%) which is located in Bodmin another visit to plan?

Treasurer Sue Stevens introduced the Financial Report and discussed how many subscriptions had been paid. She encouraged all members to pay outstanding fees as soon as possible.

The Alternative Therapy Speakers Jackie and Alice were introduced by Speaker Secretary Gail Wilson. They covered topics of the use of CBD in medication and reflexology. During part of the session we were encouraged to experience what reflexology exercises feel like and were told how they are benificial for health and wellbeing. A most interesting and enjoyable session.

After the refreshment break, the book group reported on April's novel, Last One at the Party by Bethany Clift.

It's Clay Poppy making time again! Linda Hallwood gave an outline of the clay poppy activity for 2022. The first meeting will be May 6th 9.30-11.30 in the Memorial Hall. Members were asked to sign up if they were interested in making poppies for the November Commemorations and fourteen did. . It is hoped that the display this year will out-shine the spectacular one of 2021.

The Village Hall Committee are happy for Crantock WI to plant a tree in their grounds in commemoration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Position and type of native tree to be discussed.

Lynne Wilson updated us on our part in the village Jubilee celebrations. We will be providing cream teas and those who wish to will make bunting.

Linda Hallwood passed on the request from NFWI to knit corgis to be hidden around the Eden Project for children who visit to find.

The competition winners for this month were announced by Colleen Bright, Competitions Organiser. From an excellent selection of entrants, Salli Blackford was first with beautiful watercolour sketches of spring flowers and animals. Juliet Weller came second with a collection of items encapsulating her view of Spring. Sue Fern came 3rd with a beautiful vase of flowers from her garden. Every year we award a prize to the member who has scored the most points over the year in the competitions. This year the winner was Gail Wilson. President Linda Hallwood presented her with the trophy. Next month the competition is Jubilee Cupcake.

Following the relaxation of Covid safety regulations, it had been suggested that we bring back the singing of Jerusalem. Further, as Her Majesty is our patron, we considered whether we sing the National Anthem at the end of the meetings over the Jubilee period. A vote was taken for each and the result was to sing both songs starting at our next meeting in May.

Proceedings ended with the singing of Happy Birthday to Jane Procter whose birthday was actually on that day. Jane also received a card and posie.

#### Notes from an Exhibition by Patrick Gale

Patrick Gale was born on the Isle of Wight in 1962. He attended Winchester College: New College Oxford and now lives in Cornwall where he bases many of his books. He was not always an author, he started out as a singing waiter, an encyclopedia salesman and a ghost writer before publishing his first book in 1986. In all he has written 12 novels.

As well as Cornwall featuring in his books he writes about marriage and family life. When not writing he helps out on his husband's farm and is Chair of St Endellion Summer Festival.

Notes from an Exhibition is a poignant, compelling tale of family life and the tension that both binds and pulls it apart, a theme Gale uses in other books. It deals with artistic obsession, death and depression with all the subtlety, humour and humanity Gale is renowned for. The story revolves around Rachel Kelly and her family as they deal with the legacy of her life and death, her secrets, artistic impulse and mental illness. Rachels family discover so many things they never knew about her past and helped them understand how they formed who she was.

We found most of the book fascinating and an enjoyable read. Some parts did drag but overall, we were pleased we I read it.
