



Cubert Parish Social Club

Update Report No2

Members of Cubert Village Hall (CVH) Committee and myself have been subject to numerous rumours and gossip within the Parish that the CVH is against a Cubert Parish Social Club (CPSC) being located at the CVH.

This is certainly not the case.

The CVH Committee fully support the proposal of a Cubert Parish Social Club at the Cubert Village Hall.

- 1. The community needs a place of social gathering since the demise of The Anvil. The CPSC would benefit in the business generated by supporting CVH functions and bookings.
- 2. The CVH would benefit as an attractive asset that could be promoted to increase much needed income from weddings, parties, quizzes, bingo and dances etc.

A positive proposition in that both CPSC & CVH benefit from each other's activities.

A survey was carried out in Feb 2022 to support this and the full resulting report can be viewed on the CVH Website – search for Cubert Village Hall

Next steps.

If a social club is to be located at the CVH, a sub-committee to the current management committee would need to be formed in order to manage and run the project.

As the CVH is a registered charity, the Charity Commission rules that the CPSC would have to be a sub-committee to the CVH management committee.

The sub-committee would be responsible for the business plan and, when given the go-ahead, the planning, raising of funds, placing contracts and once built the running and management of the social club.

Therefore, if The Cubert Parish Social Club is to happen.....

- 1. Any parishioner that is interested in forming a CPSC needs to hold a public meeting to form a working committee.
- 2. When the committee has formulated a business plan this needs to be presented to the CVH Management Committee to be voted on.
 - If carried, the CPSC working committee would then become the sub-committee to the CVH management committee.



It won't be long before beach activity comes to an end and training will begin in the pool. Every year we remember we are so fortunate to have the





Sadly as in previous seasons only undersized bass are being caught, fish of 3lbs and over are no longer found in our Atlantic surf beaches, this also applies to Mackerel, the few that are being caught are small, in past seasons autumn would produce what is called Atlantic Mackerel, good sized fish normally caught while ledgering on the bottom with sand eel bait.

Cllr. M. Smith detailed the possibility of the Carnival Committee using the store at the Village Square Toilets. This with the existing store at the Village Hall would provide adequate storage for the Carnival Committee's current needs. Resolved that: The Parish Council would make this store available to the Carnival Committee subject to the Carnival Committee entering into an appropriate agreement for the use of the premises.

CUBERT VILLAGE HALL CONSTITUTION

The draft new Constitution for the Village Hall was discussed. The Parish Council had a number of observations. Resolved that: The Parish Council reply to the Village Hall Committee thanking them for forwarding a copy of the proposed new Constitution and provide the Village Hall Committee with the Parish Council's comments requesting their response before proceeding further.

ANY OTHER RELEVANT BUSINESS NOT REQUIRING DECISIONS AT THIS MEETING:

Cllr. W. Caff informed the Council that he had stepped down from the Carnival Committee. He commented on the good turnout of volunteers for the clearing of the Churchfields to Trebisken footpath. Similar events are planned to clear more of the Parish Footpaths. Cllr. M. Smith commented on the forthcoming Coronation. The Carnival Committee would like to do something in a similar vein to the Jubilee celebrations.

CLOSING, DATE OF NEXT MEETING: The meeting was closed 7.46pm.

The Regular Parish Council meeting to be held on 19th October 2022 at 7.00pm in the Village Hall

Whilst I sit here reflecting on the wool industry in Cornwall I am reminded that historically, Justices of the Peace (magistrates) have been given many unusual roles by the Crown, including checking the co-operation with an unusual act of parliament.

In 1667 and 1678 two "Burial in Wool" acts were passed, which required that everyone who was buried, including monarchy, had to be wrapped either in wool, or wearing wool or placed in wool lined coffins, unless they had been victims of the plague.

King Charles II had passed this law in order to support the failing wool economy by encouraging the sale of English sheep's wool. Revenue from wool had been a major staple of the Crown's income since the middle ages but this was reducing. There is no doubt that the new Acts would not only help the local wool industry in Cornwall, but at the same time would generate much needed income for the Crown and of course the Church, who were also given a percentage.

It fell upon the local Justices of the Peace to have sworn before them, an affidavit or confirmation that burial in wool had been done. Failure to swear such an affidavit to a JP within 8 days of a person's death resulted in a fine of £5 - perhaps that was an early form of victim's surcharge? Of course, if it was later discovered that perjury had been committed (presumably someone must have opened the coffin to check) then the penalty could much more severe – even death.

The Acts were repealed in 1814 although it is apparent that many people had stopped abiding by it about 50 years earlier. However, if you happen to be the sort of person who likes to research their ancestry and look into parish records between 1667 - 1814 you will frequently see "Buried in Woollen, Aff" (or sometimes just 'A') written next to the burial record. This means an affidavit had been sworn stating the body was wrapped in wool. Occasionally however, some records state "Naked" indicating that the family of the deceased could not afford any wool.

Ravens at the Tower of London have had more than £12000 spent on them in the last two years. 8 Birds cost more than £6,000 in food and vet bills annually. Raven master Christopher Skaife said life was not easy during the pandemic as they needed a social life and they only saw him during the lockdown and missed the tourists.

The Ravens are traditionally believed to protect the monarchy which will

fall if they leave.

Red Kites have learned that people with picnic baskets are an ideal opportunity to swoop in to steal food. They can be very frightening as they have a 6 ft wing-span. They are protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981. Recent attacks have been at Mill Meadows In Henley-on-Thames Oxon. A military Chinook struck a Red Kite which Prompted an emergency landing in a field in Uckfield, East Sussex. It was grounded for ½ hour.



On the 29th August Ben Hocking had a flock of Long-Tailed Tits in his garden for about 10 minutes, and again on 1st September. These beautiful birds never settle for long, and are constantly on the move.

In the tropical biome at Eden you may be lucky enough to see the Roul-Roul birds. These tiny ground dwelling birds are quite happy there and even breed.

In August locally in Cornwall Avian Flu (Bird Flu) became prevalent, with dead sea birds being ashore particularly on the Isles of Scilly. Towards the end of August all the birds at Mousehole Bird Hospital were culled. Paradise Park took measures such as foot baths as you enter and putting netting over the Penguin enclosure to prevent Gulls makinf contact at feeding times.

On the 29th August Paignton Zoo closed to evaluate the situation.

Message in a bottle with its story was in second place, entered by Ann Bruce whose son found it on a local beach. Third place was awarded to Linda Hallwood who brought a piece of mounted needle work created by a friend in which items from the beach were incorporated. After announcing the winners, Colleen Bright announced the competition title for next month, 'My Family', which can be interpreted in any form, a poem, painting, photograph, family's favourite food etc..

The village Bale Push was a great success and our Crantock Does Poppies stall, collecting for the British Legion Poppy Appeal, did well too. CRANTOCK W.I. VISIT TO KRESEN KERNOW 15TH SEPTEMBER 2022

Eleven of us were met by Tamsin Mallett, the Collections and Development Manager at Kresen Kernow. Tamsin explained the background to the new building housing Cornish archive material some dating back 800 years.

The old Records Office located in Truro had reached its useful life and was not fit for purpose. A new site was sourced with funding from the Heritage Lottery (over £11m). Three sites were shortlisted, the old brewery in Redruth being the favoured option.

Tamsin explained how it was sympathetically re-built - it had been derelict for many years - using original stonework, structural pillars and refurbished granite floors. Accessibility, sensory areas, education were all taken into account in the rebuild and it is truly a lovely facility. Even the strongroom which is a modern concrete structure has won an award! The old brewery chimney was restored and forms a real focal point in the administration office.

We had a behind the scenes tour of the restoration and digitisation room and viewed some of the exhibition items in the strongroom. The strongroom is a purpose built, climate controlled area that has room for at least another 20 years worth of material. The archivists receive a constant source of material - some neatly boxed and listed - but they have also had their fair share of items in bin bags to delve into!
