# **Cubert Parish food parcels**

The Parish Council is aware that some residents will be experiencing concern and hardship about the inflationary food and utility bills for this coming winter ('a choice between heat and eat'), and intends to use some Community Benefit Trust funding to provide food parcels for those in need within the parish. (Proof of parish residency and identity will be required).

If you or your family are experiencing problems balancing payments for heating or food this winter, then perhaps you might wish to collect one of the food parcels being made available, starting in December. The food parcels will consist of tinned and dry goods which will provide the basis for quite a number of meals, and will be provided on a first come first served system (when its gone, its gone).

There are quite a number of parcels being made available, and those parcels are being made available to those in need, rather than a free giveaway to all. The Parish Council therefore asks that residents consider whether they do need help in their personal circumstances before attending.

The parcels will be available between 4.30pm and 7pm on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> December at the Beacon of Light (Methodist) Chapel, in Cubert. You should bring with you a recent Cubert Parish utility bill, form of identification (your name on both), and a couple of carrier bags to take the provisions away. There will be no check on personal means or finances.

If you are unwell and unable to pick up a parcel yourself, then please arrange for a note to be posted into the "Newsletter" box outside the Cubert Post Office, or arrange for a proxy to pick up the parcel, with the utility bill, note, and carrier bags on the day.

Committee Meeting Held 24th October

#### FLAT ROOF COMPLETED

Thank you to Proper Job Flat Roofing in Holywell Bay for the excellent job done on the flat roof replacement. This was thankfully done in time before the many heavy rain storms we have had recently.

#### MAIN HALL AND FOYER PARQUET FLOOR REFURBISHMENT

After 40 years, the parquet flooring in the hall needs refurbishment. If we left if any longer it would mean total floor replacement. A test piece was done on 24<sup>th</sup> Oct and the loose tiles have been fixed back in place and the skirting painted a matt black. On Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December the refurbishment starts in earnest with the Main Hall closed, reopening on Tues 3<sup>rd</sup> Jan 2023.

#### CUBERT VILLAGE HALL CONSTITUTION

A constitution, based on the conveyance dated June 1951, has been created in modern parlance and brought up to date using the proforma from the Charity Commission and the GOV.UK Charity trustee information. This has been ratified by the CVH Management Committee as of July 2022 who, at the AGM on 14th September 2022, approved the document. After the AGM a period of time was given for comments and the constitution unanimously approved at a Special General Meeting on Monday October 24<sup>th</sup>. A copy of the constitution is available on our website.

#### **COMMITTEE ROOM**

After PAT testing was carried out, one of the two heaters in the committee room had to be removed. The remaining heater was not powerful enough to heat the room and a new heater has been installed. We are organizing a working party from the committee, to tidy up the decoration using paint from the last redecoration of the hall.

#### **CAR PARK SURFACES**

Car Park Surface – Front and Rear – no change. Funding required therefore on to do list

#### WORK REPORT LOG

In order to understand and control the village hall maintenance work and new work which includes any administrative projects e.g. the new constitution, the new Chairman introduced a Work Report Log in August 2021. To give you an idea of how much work has been achieved the statistics from that log as of 18<sup>th</sup> Nov 2022 are shown below. Tasks range from the new storerooms, fixing lights through to refurbishing the floor. The major projects have been reported upon in previous parish newsletters our website and noticeboards.

62 completed tasks, 8 Open tasks (not assigned to a person to look after as yet), 6 On hold tasks – not urgent, 6 Ongoing tasks – assigned to a person to look after and is in progress.

A priority is given to each task when entered onto the log so we know what to do first.

#### **CAN YOU HELP ?**

Your village hall is in desperate need of a volunteer DIY assistant to carry out small jobs as we only have one DIY person currently doing everything on his own. This will help keep the hall running, up to standard and help reduce costs.





## **BIRD NOTES**

Choughs's where extinct in England until a small population recolonised Cornwall in the early 2000s. The R.S.P.B. is actively managing habitat for Choughs at South Stack, Ramsey and on nature reserves: Choughs mainly feed on short grazed grassland and heath. The R.S.P.B. is asking World leaders to secure biodiversity lost by 2030 at December's U.N. Summit and urging strong measures.

Ring Ouzles are being fitted with GPS tags to help us better understand their movements in the hope of addressing the causes of the long-term decline of his 'Red listed species'.

The latest survey showed a 29% decline since 1999. Ring Ouzles migrate South in the Autumn to spend the winter in North Africa.

As the weather gets colder please start feeding birds in your garden remember to always put out some water for drinking and bathing. Little Egrets are still being seen in the Gannel Estuary. On the 27th of October Val Eardley saw 9. (a personal record for her)

Avian flu advice - if you come across a dead bird do not touch it but report it. In England'call the D.F.R.A. helpline on 03459 335577.

On the 17th of October a jet have to return to Heathrow after a bird strike knocked out one of his engines at 30,000 ft over the Essex Coast. Passengers were terrified and firefighters and police lined the runway as the plane made an emergency touchdown.

The Blackburnian Warbler on Bryher is very unlikely to return to its' usual habitat as it will be unable to cope with headwinds.

Locally Choughs are being seen in increasing numbers, towards the end of October Tim Hodder saw about 7 in the group at Polly Joke he said they kept moving so proved difficult to count. How the Chough population has increased since 28th April 2010 when Ben Hocking excitedly phoned me to tell me he has seen 2 at Penhale.



Thursday 20th October saw a group attend the Silver Screen Newquay's screening of Fishermen's Friends 2. We were not disappointed and thoroughly enjoyed seeing local landmarks and hearing local accents.

On the 18th October, 15 of us met at the Bay Tree for coffee and cakes and one or two late breakfasts. We also engaged in some retail therapy in the local stores. A most satisfying morning was had by all.

Seven of us attending the Annual Council Meeting on the 26th October. The report, written by Linda Hallwood, follows.

The meeting opened with a welcome from Federation Chair Helen Kestle. This was followed by a short speech from the Right Worshipful the Mayor of Truro, Steven Webb, who told us about equality and diversity in the city.

The business of the morning was covered quite quickly and was followed by the National Federation Chair's Address. Ann Jones has been a WI member for many years. She told us about her family and home in Wales where she farms sheep and manages the property they own. Her message was that we should all be positive and inclusive in our WI's and, in this way, new members will be attracted and stay.

She admitted that the AGM in Liverpool had been a 'disaster' with low numbers attending. However, many had watched on line and she felt this is possibly the way forward in future.

Fund raising was highlighted and the move to include more charities we can raise funds for. She did stress that we should ensure value for money for members, make sure we have good speakers and, above all, encourage members to enjoy their WI meetings and events.

The Cornwall Rock Choir was the highlight of the morning and their second visit to this event did not disappoint. The audience enjoyed singing along which created a great atmosphere. We all went off to lunch feeling uplifted.

We returned after lunch to a series of short anecdotes about Her Majesty the Queen, related by WI members. This was followed by a plea from each Arts and Leisure subcommittees to join them if you have a skill in their area. It seems that all sub committees are short on numbers. If these groups fail there will be fewer events for us to take part in.

Speaker Dr Annie Grey followed, telling us about her new book on Georgina Landemare nee Young who was Winston Churchill's cook. She was born into a time when the gap between rich and poor was huge and started in service as a scullery maid. She climbed the cookery ladder getting better jobs in this area, working for the wealthy of this country. She married a French chef 25 years her senior and worked with him, albeit in his shadow. After his death when she was still in her early fifties she went freelance, cooking for special receptions and events, making her name as a sought after cook. Although she had worked occasionally for the Churchills during this time, it was not until the start of the second World War, when she could see that there would be few balls and great events taking place, she became their 'home-maker'. She became a permanent fixture in their houses, including number 10, and published 'Recipes for number 10' while there. Eventually she became ill and went to live with her daughter but never lost touch with Clementine Churchill. She died at the age of 96.

Dr Grey took questions at the end and everyone in the audience said how interesting and well told her talk had been.

Overall, the council meeting was most enjoyable and has given much food for thought if you will pardon the pun.

Our monthly meeting on 8th November was very well attended. We now have 40 members which may be a record. It is great to see so many members attending.

Secretary Ann Evans gave information about the NFWI Annual meeting 2023 at which we will be representing a number of WIs in our area. She also informed us of the subjects to consider for the Resolution. These are: Save our water, Women-women-tea workers, On line gambling and Clean rivers for people and wildlife. A vote will be taken in December.

#### CRANTOCK W.I. - BOOK REVIEW Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet - James Ford

The author is the great grandson of a Nevada mining pioneer, Min Chung, who emigrated from China. He adopted the Western name Ford. The stories his great grandfather told were the inspiration for this book.

It is a story that packs a lot in. It is about family relationships, old world versus new, ethnicity and love. It tells the story of Henry then and now. During the Second World War the Chinese were accepted in America but because of Pearl Harbour, the Japanese were badly treated and eventually sent to internment camps. The book tells of the struggle between a teenager and his traditionalist father and the pain and the trauma of separation of the Chinese-American Henry and his Japanese-American friend Keiko.

The Panama Hotel is a real place and the belongings of 37 Japanese families were stored there. Oscar Holden was also a real person but you will not be able to find the lost vinyl record.

All members of the book group enjoyed reading this book. A number said they found the historical element fascinating as they were not aware of the difficulties and prejudices the Japanese at the time experienced. It filled in what is often a hazy part of history. I would certainly recommend this book; it is easy to read and well written.
