



Committee Meeting Held 10th January

BREAKING NEWS VILLAGE HALL FLOOR REFURBISHED

The management committee are pleased to announce that the parquet floor laid in 1982 has now been refurbished to such a standard that it almost looks as good as new. The company worked very hard from the 16th December to the 23rd December. The floor was then left to 'cure' over Christmas and the New Year and first used on Tuesday 3rd January. The feedback from many of our users has been very complimentary and we hope this will keep the floor for many more years to come.

CAR PARKS PROJECT

These are now showing signs of wear and beginning to pothole, both front and rear. The ambition is to resurface the car parks and we are exploring several options in terms of type of surface. After receiving quotes in March 2022, the amount of money required for tarmac is in the order of £40,000 average, which will have risen. Even if we did the front and rear in separate financial years this is still a large amount of money to find. Gravel surface for the rear will be considered.

The CVH management committee are now looking at sources of funding for this project.





The Cornish Cross at Cubert Church

It is known, from surviving examples, fragments and documents, that there were once over 650 medieval crosses in Cornwall. Their weathered appearance



and sometimes simple form and decoration encouraged very early dates to be suggested for them. This has led to their common description as "Celtic". However the oldest are probably no earlier than the late ninth or early tenth century and the majority of wayside crosses twelfth century or later.

There is a single surviving cross in Cubert Ecclesiastical Parish, a wayside cross removed from its previous location about 1860. It had stood in Ellenglaze Lane but its actual site seems not to have been recorded. However there is a clue in the Cubert Tithe Award of 1840. The field to the west of the Church, now part of Churchfields, is recorded as being named 'Cross Ground'. It is almost certain that

the Cross would have stood somewhere along the south eastern side of



Ellenglaze Lane between Lanlovie Meadow to the entrance to Ellenglaze Meadow. Later maps show a footpath from the Church coming out on Ellenglaze Lane opposite the Ellenglaze Meadow entrance making this the more likely specific location of the Cross. One might speculate that it was set there to show the route to St Piran's Oratory or the later Norman Church.

With the Cross set against the exterior wall of the north transept of the Church its rear face is obscured, no one now living will have seen it and no record was made as to what it looks like. The front is better reproduced in a sketch than photograph due to the lichen which has built up on the face and the low relief of the carving. It is recorded (Old Cornish Crosses, Arthur G. Langdon; 1896) that "On the head is an irregularly shaped cross with wide limbs. In the middle is a large square sinking having rounded angles." The shaft that currently supports it is not contemporary with the Cross, it "formerly stood outside the churchyard, but what purpose it served does not appear to be known."

Charles Henderson (The Ecclesiastical History of the four Western Hundreds of Cornwall; Journal of the Royal Institution of Cornwall 1956) offers a field name, 'Grous Ver', as

suggestive of the site of a lost cross. This could be a field at <u>Treworgan</u> on Wesley Road opposite <u>Carines</u> Cottages, the 'Little <u>Grousen'</u> of 1840. There is however no other evidence to support this suggestion.





The Atlantic Geomatics Burial Grounds Project

On Tuesday the 17th January the village awoke to a blanket of snow. Soon children and a good few parents were building snowmen and throwing snow balls, but amidst the merriment, one person was photographing gravestones in Cubert church yard in a High Vis jacket.

This was Amy, a surveyor for the Atlantic Geomatics Burial Ground Project. In conjunction with the Church of England and other partners, this project aims to record and digitise every burial ground in the country. The Diocese of Truro, along with the Diocese of Carlisle are among the first to participate in this exciting project.

The digital map and database which the project creates will be available through the Church Heritage Record, although I suspect that for the truly historical curious nothing will beat wandering around a church yard on a snowy day!

If you're not familiar with your local churchyard, why not visit and see what you can find?





Ten of the rarest sheep in Britain are helping to protect endangered gulls. The Boreray will eat bushes to clear nest sites for Lesser Black-Backed Gulls on Flat Holm in the Bristol Channel. Experts say the sheep, originally from the Outer Hebrides, can create critical nesting sites. Gull numbers are down from 4,000 pairs to 1,691. The sheep are from a flock raised by Faith Green, aged 15, of Winscombe, Somerset.

Locally, on 17th/18th December Ben Hocking had a redwing in his garden, also a fieldfare eating apples.

RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch

The RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch took place from 27th to 29th January. Anyone participating was asked to record the total number of each species in a one hour period. The results will be announced in April. Results from participants can be returned until 14th February to https://www.rspb.org.uk/get-involved/activities/birdwatch/birdwatch-take-part/ using the code BH21, or by post to FREEPOST, RSPB BIG GARDEN BIRDWATCH.

Bewick swans are disappearing from our shores. Although it is the World's smallest swan, this species makes it's summer home across the wild Siberian tundra. In winter they escape the freezing darkness to such places as South East Asia, the Caspian Sea or some travel the 4,500 miles to North West Europe, including the UK, notably to the headquarters of the Wildfowl and Wetlands Treust at Slimbridge.

Last year, Swifts were added to the UK Red list, their population having dropped by over half since 1995. Their decline may be connected to their nest holes on buildings being blocked by insulation and home improvement measures, possibly compounded by wetter summers. The Feather Speech Campaign created by author and conservationist Hannah Bourne-Taylor has launched a petition, supported by the RSPB, calling for Swift bricks to be made compulsory in new housing developments across Britain. These bricks also benefit other Red listed species such as the House Martins, Starlings and House Sparrows.



CRANTOCK W.I. BOOK REVIEW

THE PASTURES OF HEAVEN BY JOHN STEINBECK

John Steinbeck was born in Salinas in 1902 and as a young man he witnessed The Great Depression and the huge impact that poverty had on so many lives. He went to University but left before getting a degree and worked as a labourer and journalist while writing his first novel. He was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1962 and died in 1968

The majority of our book group enjoyed reading this book despite Steinbeck's obsession with despair and depression. He writes beautifully and can describe a person or a situation in a short sentence. He seems to have a fascination with misfits in society, the insane, those with learning difficulties or deformities. How society treats them and how they manage to get through life.

The Pastures of Heaven has a clear introduction and ending with the linked short stories in the middle about people living in this apparently idyllic community. The stories are mostly linked by the appearance of a member of the Munroe family. The Salinas valley is a rich farming area and The Pastures of Heaven is no different, yet some families prosper and others do not often because of a choice they have made which then determines whether they will prosper or fail. Like many small communities the school and village store are central meeting places and gossip is rife.

The stories are varied, many are sad or disturbing or have a bad ending. Running through the stories is a subtle black humour which is characteristic of Steinbeck's writing.

For the sheer beauty of Steinbeck's writing skill, I can recommend this book.
