
And when it comes to life's problems, there will always be a 'next time'. So each time you begin to feel anxious, say. "I trust God completely; there is no need to worry!"

Registration will be open from 1pm - 2pm on the day at the village Church Field, STRICTLY NO ENTRIES AFTER 1.45pm For Toddler Trot or 2PM for One Mile Race. For those who have pre-booked online, they can pick up their Ankle Tag/Race Number. The cost per competitor will be £4.50 for online registration only, to be paid via bacs (payment details are on the online Registration Form) Registration for Toddlers is also online at a cost of £3.50 (strictly under 5's only) The Course will be approximately ¼ of a mile around the field. Last entry will be 1.50pm. There will be trophies for 1st, 2nd and 3rd male/female toddlers.

Optional Fancy Dress with any theme - in view of the Event, a Royal theme would be a suggestion. Judging will take place before race at 1.45pm and will then receive a Cup at the Presentation.

The 1 mile route will be a measured course. The results will be available after the race and will be put on the David Ball website: www.davidballagencies.co.uk

Each competitor of both races, will receive a medal, a goodie bag and a drink after the race. The Presentation of Trophies for both races which will be at approximately 4pm onwards, when all results are in. The Race will be fully marshaled and part of the course route will go through the village and surrounding streets, then return to do another lap of the field. The One Mile Race will be chipped timed to give the runners their results as soon as possible.

This year, the mat will be wider and runners will be asked to start in order of their ability. The field will be adequately staked, wide enough for the runners to have space to pass and will be super beneficial for spectators.

First Aiders will be present. Parking and toilets will be available.

The Cubert & Holywell Carnival Committee ran a quiz to raise money and split the proceedings between themselves and the Cubert Village Hall. We received £112 and this has now been spent on new heavy duty door closers for the front doors ( the old ones had been adjusted many times and the oil had eventually leaked out) with the remaining money going towards the lights repair in the hall. Thank you to all those who joined in on the night and helped raise the money.

#### NEW FACEBOOK PAGE

The village hall started planning a new facebook page in early February after searching for, since late Last year, and finding a volunteer to help build and maintain the page. The page will be announced on our website, noticeboards and in the relevant parish newsletter as soon as it is up and running. This will help us in conveying information to a much wider audience and also help to promote the hall

#### REFURBISHED FLOOR

Due to heavy scratching in the first month, the hall floor has had a touch up on the 4<sup>th</sup> Feb. It was recognised from the result of this second very light sanding that a lot of the heavy scratching was down to gravel and debris being brought in on shoes. Another lacquer layer was added and it is now looking smart again. We are therefore in the process of ordering external and new internal mats to go by the emergency doors at the rear of the hall and a new mat for the foyer. Until they arrive we have temporarily asked users to not use the emergency doors except in an emergency. THANK YOU





Cllr. A. Percy has obtained quotes for signage (Maps) to show where items of interest are around the Parish.

CUBERT VILLAGE HALL - Parish Councillors present expressed their disappointment in the secrecy and lack of openness being exhibited by the Village Hall committee. Cllr. D. Hopkinson explained the actions of the Village Hall committee and supported the current village hall chairman and treasurer. Cllr. A. Percy announced that he is standing down as Chairman of the Parish Council at the end of this meeting as he does not feel he can continue in position when access to the village hall accounts and minutes are being denied, and when he has concerns over the way the Village Hall is being managed. Cllr. D. Hopkinson announced that she is standing down as Parish Council representative to the village hall.

#### ANY OTHER RELEVANT BUSINESS NOT REQUIRING DECISIONS AT THIS MEETING:

W. Caff announced that regrettably, due to a health issue, he is standing down as footpaths representative. Cllr. S. Bell – Asked about ID cards for Councillors. It was decided to look at providing ID cards for Councillors. Cllr. S. Bell to look into the design of such.








#### **CRANTOCK W.I. BOOK REVIEW**

Once Upon a Time by Diane Setterfield

This book was the latest offering from the author, Diane Setterfield, whose first novel, The Thirteenth Tale, was a bestseller which was also made into a TV drama. This latest novel is set in the early 19 Century and begins with a Storytelling Night in the Ships Inn, a pub



on the Thames – when a stranger carrying a drowned girl interrupts proceedings. The child, who was originally thought dead, mysteriously comes back to life and the book is the story of how various families stake their claim for the child. One family the Vaughans have lost a daughter, Amelia two year's earlier and for a while successfully convince everyone that the child is rightfully theirs. A second family, headed up by Robin Armstrong, a black farmer is convinced that the girl is his granddaughter abandoned by his wayward son. The Parson's housekeeper, Lilly is equally sure that she is the reborn sister that she lost years earlier.

The novel is centred around the river and is a mystical, evocative tale intertwined with folklore and magic. It takes the reader on a journey of the villagers and their lives with the river central to the whole novel and the ever present image of the ferryman waiting to claim the dead and transport them away in his boat.

At times the number of different characters can become a little difficult to follow, particularly if you were reading the book with gaps in between. What we liked about it was the rich imagery and the atmosphere that the author manages to conjure up. We particularly enjoyed the beginning which grabbed you right from the outset and left you wanting to understand the mystery behind what happened to the drowned child. We also liked the fact that it was no particular genre of book but included crime, mystery and romance all rolled into one.

The denouement is a little contrived with Daunt and Rita Sunday staging a magic show to flush out the perpetrator which succeeding in traumatising Lily into revealing that she thought she had killed her baby sister. This leads to an unravelling which eventually reveals the actual perpetrators of the crime who meet a fitting end.

Overall, the group would recommend this book as something different and unusual and one which takes the reader on a dazzling journey in the true spirit of storytelling.

#### Carter's Rocks (aka Gull Rocks), Holywell Bay

A number of the rocky islets off our immediate coast have bird related names, Holywell's 'Gull Rocks' and 'The Goose' off Crantock Beach with 'The Chick' between at Kelsey Head. However the pair of rocks off **Penhale Point** have another name in 'Carter's Rocks' and it is this that is somewhat of a conundrum, where did the name 'Carter' come from?

Latterly it has been suggested that this is a reference to the famous Carter Brothers, 18thC smugglers who operated around Mounts Bay. The eldest, John, was styled 'King of Prussia' after his supposed resemblance to Frederick the Great (1712-1786) and his younger brother Harry who became a committed Methodist after giving up smuggling. The Carters smuggling activities centred around Prussia Cove (which takes its present name after John, it was formerly Cornish 'Porthleah') in Mount's Bay; there is no record of them operating on the north Cornish coast. An important fact however is a 1748 map by Thomas Martyn. Martyn was a local man, born in Gwennap in 1695. From about 1730 Martyn was employed as a surveyor mapping various Cornish estates. This led to him surveying the whole County on foot, an exercise which it is reported took him about 15 years. Unsurprisingly there are no records of him having a wife or family. By 1748 Martyn had produced his 1 inch to 1 mile map of Cornwall. Martyn's map shows a level of accuracy and detail confirming a thorough



survey rather than a re-hash of previous cartographer's work. The important part here is that Martyn annotates the Penhale Point islets as 'Carter's Rock'. Where did he get the name 'Carter', not from earlier maps which say 'Gull Rock' if they show a name at all? This suggests an actual visit and probably local enquiry. Clearly this could not have occurred after 1748, the year in which the map was completed but must have been sometime in the 15 years (1732-1747) of his perambulations. Now John Carter was born in 1738 and Harry in 1749. Clearly the name cannot relate to their activities for even if Martyn visited in the last year of his survey (1747) John would only be 9 years old and Harry not yet born.

To find the answer we must start much further back in time to a legacy of William the Conqueror; the Domesday Survey. Amongst the entries for Cornwall is one for the manor of 'Halwyn'. The approximate boundaries of this manor were from the southern end of Holywell Beach following the stream inland along the Ellenglaze Valley to the vicinity of Seven Bridges south of Trebisken. From here, remembering boundary features have since been obscured by the drifting sands, it trended south west to the vicinity of St Piran's Cross and then north west to the northern end of Perran Beach south of Ligger Point. It therefore included Penhale Point. Come forward about five hundred years and Halwyn is in the ownership of a Mr John Kearne from whom it was purchased in 1578 by a Mr Carter. Here we have the actual reason for the name, the Carter family's ownership of Penhale Point as part of the ancient manor of Halwyn. The Carters also owned land in Cubert, the 1680 Cubert Glebe Terrier records lands adjoining glebe fields as 'Carter's land' and occupied 'by Carter's tenants'. In the 1727 Terrier 'Carter' is substituted with 'the heirs of Carter'. The phrase 'the heirs of' suggests that the last male Carter had died, his property would have been split between surviving female relatives whom, by custom, were often not identified by name.

An Isabelline Wheatear, a very rare visitor to Cornwall, appeared on the Kelseys on 24<sup>th</sup> January. This species is usually found in the Gobi Desert in Asia. Large numbers of "twitchers" – people who want to see another species to tick off their list - turned up to catch a glimpse of this bird. On the 26<sup>th</sup> January, an Isabelline Wheatear was seen at Seaton, Devon.

The Big Garden Birdwatch took place on 27-29<sup>th</sup> January and participants were asked to record total numbers of each species they saw in an hour. Locally good numbers were recorded. I had eleven species, Ben Hocking had 16 species. I saw good numbers of Goldfinches (they gorged themselves on white hearts and Niger seed).

Fears were raised for Britain's Puffin population after hundreds were washed up dead on the shores of Tenerife in the Canary Islands in the last few days of January. More had been ringed in Scotland than other locations. Scotland is home to more than 80% of the British and Irish Puffin population. British ornithologists called fir urgent research to establish the cause of the deaths.

A rare White Tailed Eagle has returned to the UK minus a foot after flying 10,000 miles over two years. The bird of prey was tracked by GPS, visiting France, the Netherlands, Denmark and Sweden. It was the first of a group released on the Isle of Wight to cross the Channel into Europe. Conservationists found the eagle, known as G463, lost one foot a year ago. Expert Tim Mackvill said, "They grab fish with their feet so I suppose he's learnt to adapt." Another White Tailed Eagle found dead on the Isle of Wight was not unlawfully killed, say police. The mountain-based Ptarmigan hhas been spotted for the first time in 200 years in Orkney.

Tim Hodder saw male and female Black Caps on his feeders and said they appeared at the same time last year. He also saw beautiful Long-tailed Tits. Nicola Phillips also saw Black Caps, Long-tailed Tits, Coal Tits and a Greater Spotted Woodpecker in late January/early February down on Chynoweth Farm.

Good news about Choughs locally. Tim Hodder saw four on Kelsey Head on 10<sup>th</sup> February, possibly two adult and two younger. They were displaying mutual feeds and parallel behaviour indicating that the breeding season is approaching.
