



Basic Rules are as follows:




After last year's huge success we will once again be holding our homemade beers and wines competition. The judging of the event will take place in the Cakes and Drinks Competition Tent in the Church Field during the Coronation Event.

For those of you who are interested (and we had lots of competitors last year for the Jubilee) here's a cut-down version of the competition rules. Full details can be found on the Holywell and Cubert Facebook page or by emailing catvinbeckford1@gmail.com

Rules of the competition (Mini version)

- Alcoholic drinks can be made from scratch or from kits.
- Spirits used in the preparation of a flavoured drink must be obtained from a retailer.
- Competitors must be 18 years or over.
- Each competitor can enter up to a total of 8 drinks with a maximum of 4 per category.
- Two bottles of each beer or cider must be supplied. 1 bottle of other drinks.
- Drinks to be contained in plain, unlabelled and sealed glass or plastic bottles.
- 7. Each bottle must have a tie on label around its neck OR a small sticker carrying the following info: Group type, i.e. Scratch or Kit. Category, i.e. Grape wine, Beer, Cider, Fruit/Vegetable/Flower wine etc. Description, i.e. Blackberry Wine, Stout Beer, IPA Beer, Sloe Gin etc. Alcohol by Volume, i.e. ABV = 12.5% First and last name, i.e. John Smith

Everyone had a wonderful hour as this excellent teacher taught us how to stand, breathe and sing!


After warm-up exercises we progressed to

The National Trust has reviewed last year's sightings by rangers and volunteers. Orford Ness in Suffolk had a bumper year, recording 51 pairs of at-risk Redshanks (the highest number of pairs since recording began in 2005), as well as their highest numbers of breeding pairs of Lapwings and Avocets. The Trust contributes to the State of Nature report which uses wildlife data from a group of fifty conservation organisations. One ranger says that, during his lifetime, House Sparrows have declined by 60%. On the Northumberland coast, the rangers saw the seabirds on the Farne Islands in particular struggle because of the effects of avian flu. On the plus side, Little Terns had a good breeding season as branches were laid down where the birds nest and which trapped sand and helped raise the nests above the high tides. Volunteers have built shelters to protect rare Tern chicks from Kestrels and Falcons on Gronant Beach, Denbighshire.

Five roles are being offered by the UK Antarctic Heritage Trust to count Gentoo Penguins in Port Lockroy on Goudier Island, Antarctica. The positions are being offered on the 80th anniversary of its base on the island. Duties will include daily counts of the island's approximately 1,000 Penguins.

Avian flu measures being taken at Newquay Zoo have seen the Peacocks restricted in an enclosure, the walk-through aviary closed and the Penguin enclosure completely netted over to stop mainly gulls from coming. This, I think, is a good move anyway, as gulls have always been a nuisance. Living Coasts at Torquay has always had its Penguin enclosure completely netted over. Lateral flow tests are in line for a comeback if health experts see bird flu has spread from one person to another. The instant tests provide rapid information about the threat of the disease, although experts say that H5N1 virus does not usually pass on to people and the risk remains low.

Scotland Yard's Wildlife Crime Unit is hunting someone who blasted a Red Kite (protected species) with a shotgun. The bird, with pellets in its neck and body, crash landed on tourists in Greenwich Park, South-east London. RSPCA officer Rodney Kenny said, "Miraculously the pellets missed vital organs and the bird is recovering well. Once rehabilitated he can hopefully be released back into the wild."

Flamingos make friends and hang out with like-minded pink pals in the same flock Exeter scientists found.
