Calling all wool crafters!

Keen eyed locals may have noticed that the 'Holy Well' on the beach has disappeared from recent Ordnance Survey (OS) maps. Enquiry found that the name, which has been shown since the first OS map published in 1813, has been removed by the OS. The reason given was this was for safety but that was altered to the fact that OS maps only show surface features and the Holy Well is underground in a cave.

The OS agreed to indicate the location of the cave as "St Cuthbert's Cave" as this is what the National Trust (NT) call it and English Heritage also refer to a fictitious 17thC story about St Cuthbert's relics coming to Cornwall. It is very difficult to find where the NT refer to "St Cuthbert's Cave" and at the time of writing no response has been received.

St Cuthbert (c.634-687) was a Northumbrian bishop associated with Lindisfarne and his tomb is now at Durham Cathedral. There is no reference of him or his relicts ever coming south of Northumberland. There is a story in an 'ecclesiastical history' by Jeremy Collier (1650-1726) which has the relicts of Cuthbert taken by sea from Northumberland to Ireland, all the way around the coast of England, blown ashore at Holywell where they bestowed healing powers to a well and then taken back by sea to Durham! Cuthbert is occasionally substituted in error for Cubert but had no connection whatsoever with Cornwall in general and Holywell Bay in particular.

Cubert on the other hand is a pan-Celtic Cornish saint and patron of this Parish, remembered also in Ceredigion (Wales) at Gwbert, a coastal resort close to Llangrannog, patron St Carantoc. It is unlikely that more than a tiny proportion of visitors to Holywell will know of St Cubert. Calling this cave after St Cuthbert is only going to give the impression that the Parish is named in his honour, in effect 'cancelling' Cubert.

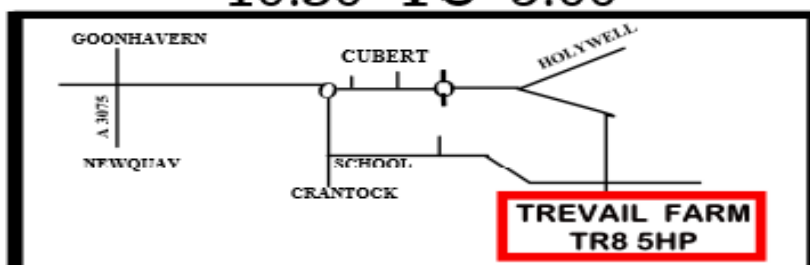

For those of you who are interested (and we had lots of competitors last year for the Jubilee) here's a cut-down version of the competition rules. Full details can be found on the Holywell and Cubert Facebook page or by emailing calvinbeckford1@gmail.com

Rules of the competition (Mini version)

1. Alcoholic drinks can be made from scratch or from kits.
2. Spirits used in the preparation of a flavoured drink must be obtained from a retailer.
3. Competitors must be 18 years or over.
4. Each competitor can enter up to a total of 8 drinks with a maximum of 4 per category.
5. Two bottles of each beer or cider must be supplied. 1 bottle of other drinks.
6. Drinks to be contained in plain, unlabelled and sealed glass or plastic bottles.
7. Each bottle must have a tie on label around its neck OR a small sticker carrying the following info: **Group type**, i.e. Scratch or Kit. **Category**, i.e. Grape wine, Beer, Cider, Fruit/Vegetable/Flower wine etc. **Description**, i.e. Blackberry Wine, Stout Beer, IPA Beer, Sloe Gin etc. **Alcohol by Volume**, i.e. ABV = 12.5% **First and last name**, i.e. John Smith

Spencer gave an update to the Parish Council – it does not appear that we will be able to get a Primary Residence policy for the Parish as a whole but maybe able to apply such a policy to Holywell Bay and the smaller hamlets of Treworgans, Trevail and Tresean. The consultants are making a start on producing a design guide.

FOOTPATHS – Ongoing maintenance going forward. Please see the notice elsewhere in the Newsletter seeking additional volunteers to help with keeping our footpaths open.

CUBERT VILLAGE HALL - Cllr. G. Rowe to check that the title of the Village Hall has been vested with Official Custodian of Charities. Cllr. R.L.B. Spencer to draft a list of questions to put to the professional advisers.

ANY OTHER RELEVANT BUSINESS NOT REQUIRING DECISIONS AT THIS MEETING:

Cllr. M. Smith asked if the Defib batteries are checked – The Clerk replied that they are checked on a weekly basis. Cllr. M. Smith said he was arranging for a water butt to be installed in the square with appropriate changes to the Guttering on the Bus stop to feed it. It was agreed that the Parish Council would refund the costs involved. Cllr. M. Smith said that the Coronation celebrations are all now in hand.

Cllr. R.L.B. Spencer informed the Parish Council that the Cabu application for Penhale Camp appears to be proceeding with more documents being posted to the Cornwall Council planning portal. He also informed the Parish Council of the upcoming meeting with National Trust regarding vehicle use of Cubert Common.

Cllr. A. Percy gave an update on the play area works and associated Community Infrastructure Levy funding.

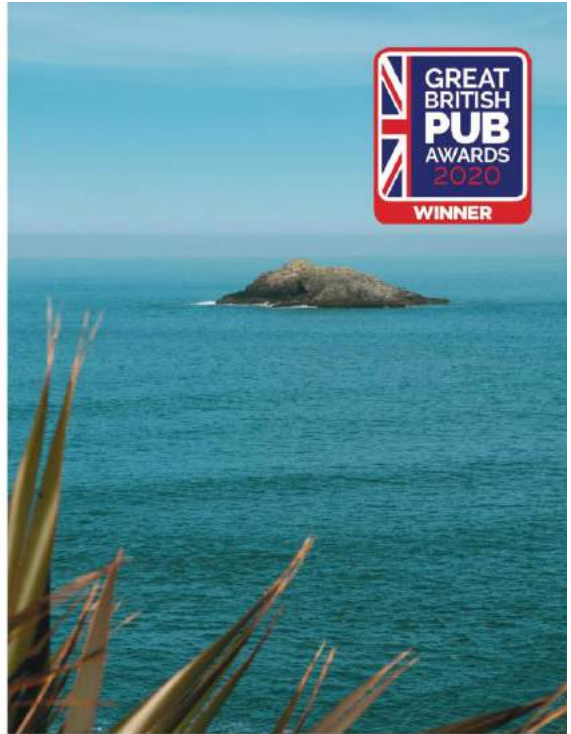

We were shown how to diagonally cut these ends and roughen them before painting the cut surfaces with a slip to make a firm connection which was then finger smoothed into a strong invisible join.



Those making jugs were given instruction on adding a shaped handle and others shown how to shape the vessel. Decorations in many forms - foliage, flowers, butterfly or abstract shapes were added. 9 very individual masterpieces were created and we all look forward to seeing them after the firing process when we will have the opportunity to paint or further decoratively treat them. The two hours passed very quickly as every one of the group concentrated intently on this new skill! It was hugely enjoyable and we would recommend others to have a go. Andy is a good and patient (he had to be) teacher who was fulsome in his genuine praise and encouragement of our efforts. Tim Hodder reported on 21st March that our local pair of Choughs were in constant movement and looked in good condition. They were carrying something to a nest site. On 9th April one Chough was making regular visits to the nest, indicating that it is likely the other bird is sitting. Tim also said the Ravens were busy and there were Swallows around about the same time as last year.

On the 17th March Cornwall Wildlife Trust found Avian Flu in five seal carcasses washed ashore on the county. Later in March, health officials said that Avian flu had been found in 23 wild mammals and 10 captive bush dogs since October 2021. Restrictions related to Avian flu were lifted on 18th April, meaning poultry and captive birds can be allowed outdoors.

Sadly, two of the four King's Swans at the Swan Support Sanctuary in Datchet, Berkshire were killed deliberately by intruders. Wendy Herman, who runs the sanctuary, saw the attack on CCTV. The two youths fired pellets from catapults at the birds. Two other birds suffered life-changing injuries and at least a dozen more were badly hurt. A 13 year old boy was convicted of causing unnecessary suffering to protected animals. The Crown retains rights over all unmarked Mute Swans found on open water in England. Donations to support Wendy's rescue work can be made via their website at <http://www.swansupport.org.uk/>

On 27th March, the RSPB found oiled birds in Poole Harbour following a pipeline leak.

On a recent visit to the Canary Islands, we went to La Palma and, although we didn't see them on this occasion, there are Choughs there. Indeed, the Chough is the symbol of the island. On other islands, we saw Collared Doves, Ravens and Kestrel, also Sparrows, which seem to be common all over the World.
