CVH Committee Meeting Held 27th June

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

It is that time of year to plan the CVH Annual General Meeting. As soon as we fix a date and time we will post advance notices on our website, facebook page, post office noticeboard and hall noticeboards. It will be too late to put a notice into the Cubert Parish Newsletter August issue as our meeting is after the deadline.. As always, the AGM meeting is open to all Cubert Parishioners. So; please keep an eye out for the date and time and attend if possible. Thank you

OPERATING COSTS

The expected operating costs of the hall, as of June 2023, stand at £10.5K per annum. The committee have agreed to retain a reserve to cover operating costs for 2 years in order to keep the hall as a going concern. The reserve value has been set at £25K permitting the extra to allow for unexpected increases in standard operating costs. Any surplus in the bank over the £25K contributes to unexpected costs regarding operating and maintenance and may also feed into funding required for improvement and development projects, such as the front and rear car park. Other charities adopt the same type of reserve strategy.

HALL CHARGES

The latest price increase was activated from 1st April 2023 and was deemed necessary due to the cost-of-living increases (in the order of 10%) particularly the huge increase in electric charges (16.3p kWh up to 57.33p per kWh - 251% – standing charge from 31.5p per day to 50.4p per day – 60%). The April 2023 increase uplifted the hourly hall charges by £1 per hour for the main hall and 50p per hour for the committee room. For example, the parishioner rate for the main hall went up from £8 to £9 per hour, 12.5%, and the evening rate £9 to £10, 11.1%. Prior to this increase the charges had been increased on 1st September 2021 and prior to this in 2016 as pre-planned by the previous committees

CUBERT AND HOLYWELL CARNIVAL COMMITTEE

The CVH is in discussions with the CHCC with regard to the usage of the fire pit created for the Queen's Jubilee. The CHCC would like it to be used as a floral display at the CVH. The CHCC would also like to create signage for a Welcome To Cubert Christmas light display and to increase their current storage at the CVH

January 2022, when I did the last Cubert NDP update, seems an age away. Looking back, I'm glad that when I was talking about the predetermined process that we would have to follow I did say "The time scale for this is, for various reasons, impossible to predict at the moment."

The intervening nineteen months has seen a continued and determined effort by the members of the Steering Group, that has led us to a point whereby we now have a First Working Draft of a plan to put forward to the parishioners of Cubert.

While not the biggest NDP ever created it does, at some seventy plus pages, make it impossible, from both a financial and logistical point of view, to create a paper copy for each household in the parish. That said it is incumbent upon the Steering Group to provide everyone in the Parish with the opportunity to read and comment on the document.

I am pleased to say that, thanks to the efforts of Andrew Griffin, we again have access to and use of our NDP website the link to which is shown below. It is proposed to publish the NDP document on the site and to provide feedback forms alongside. The document will also be uploaded on to the Parish Council website, the link to which is also shown below, from where comments should be emailed to the Clerk to the Council.

Over and above the on-line process the Steering Group will be facilitating a face-to-face consultation opportunity by way of an exhibition in the Village Hall on Saturday 9th September. The proposed policies, aims and objectives together with the rational that led to them, will be on display.

No bird notes from Rodney this month, but instead I thought you might be interested in some really positive news about what Cornwall Wildlife Trust are doing at Penhale Sands (Article courtesy of the press release on the CWT website).

Innovative excavation works have begun at Penhale Dunes near Perranporth. Cornwall Wildlife Trust have announced that the works beginning on Monday August 21st will involve using earth-moving machinery to create 'V-shaped notches' in the sand dunes, as part of a project to help restore natural dynamic processes and support the area's wildlife.

Penhale is one of the largest dune systems in Cornwall, spanning 620 hectares (1,532 acres). With sand dunes listed as the habitat most at risk in Europe for biodiversity loss, it's an incredibly important area to protect for nature. These works will rejuvenate this area of mobile dunes, helping the many species which make use of open areas of bare sand.

Jon Cripps, Penhale Dunes Ranger at Cornwall Wildlife Trust said:

"The work will look quite dramatic as it's unusual to see big diggers on the dunes, shifting loads of sand. However, this short-term disruption should create long-term benefits for lots of duneadapted wildlife.

"We'll create open spaces for plants like sea holly and sea rocket to colonise and lots of warm sandy niches for the various insects that burrow into sand, such as the tiny silvery leaf-cutter bee, the minotaur dung beetle and the predatory bee-wolf wasp! We hope the scale of the work will allow the wind to whistle through the dunes and keep these areas mobile, dynamic and diverse for many years to come."

COST OF LIVING AFFECTING YOUR HEALTH? TELL HEALTHWATCH CORNWALL ABOUT IT!

Healthwatch Cornwall has launched a major new survey to find out how the current increases in the cost of living are impacting people's access to health and social care in Cornwall. We know that people across Cornwall are being affected in many ways by increased costs, however it is not clear what effect the crisis is having on how people access health care services. Our survey aims to reach as many people as possible across the county, particularly in population groups that we don't often hear from and in areas that are hard to reach, whether for geographical or economic reasons.

Through this research, which will be shared with Cornwall Council managers and the Integrated Care Board which oversees healthcare in the county, we will improve our knowledge of the local issues people are facing in accessing health and social care. This will enable us to reach and signpost more people to the correct support and services. Having a clearer picture of why people's access to health and social care services is changing due to the cost of living, and to the specific local issues that apply to Cornwall, will help us to support services to improve so that more people can access the right service at the right time.

CRANTOCK W.I. BOOK REVIEW RESTLESS BY WILLIAM BOYD

The book starts when Ruth, learns that everything she ever knew about her mother was a carefully constructed lie. Sally Gilmartin is a respectable English widow living in picturesque Cotswold village; Eva Delectorskaya was a rigorously trained World War II spy, a woman taught to lie and deceive, and above all, to never trust anyone.

Three decades later the secrets of Sally's past still haunt her. Someone is trying to kill her and at last she has decided to trust her daughter Ruth with her story. Ruth, meanwhile, is struggling to make sense of her own life as a young single mother with an unfinished graduate degree and escalating dependence on alcohol. She is drawn deeper and deeper into the astonishing events of her mother's past—the mysterious death of Eva's beloved brother, her work in New York City manipulating the press in order to shift public sentiment toward American involvement in the war, and her dangerous romantic entanglement. Now Sally wants to find the man who recruited her for the secret service, and she needs Ruth's help.

Restless is a brilliant espionage book and a vivid portrait of the life of a female spy. Full of tension and drama, and based on a remarkable chapter of Anglo-American history, this is fine historic fiction. It's such a change to see the two main characters in a spy novel being females. The story is set in the 1970s with WWII flashbacks (the spy bits), that worked really well. A couple of red herrings thrown in for good measure but not quite believable could have been better constructed but other than this was a good story, and always interesting. There were also some excellent historical fictional aspects leaving something to research such as the British Secret Service. In general the group enjoyed it and one or two said they would try more Boyd books and look at this genre again.



FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS UPDATE

The financial accounts for the year 1/4/22 to 31/3/23 have now been independently examined and signed off. The public accounts form, CC16a, for this year will be available on our website (search for Cubert Village Hall) by the time this newsletter is published, on the ACCOUNTS tab. The form will be uploaded onto the Charity Commission (CC) website for the CVH charity number of 300534 as soon as the CC finish their re-development of the online software.

We are pleased to announce that all the backdated accounts are now up to date on the CC website. The accounts had not been registered on the CC website since 2007 as discovered in Sept 2021. We negotiated with the CC to permit time to update the financial records as we may well otherwise have lost our charity status.
