

# Village Support during the Coronavirus Epidemic

Dear Parishioner

Obviously these are strange times and we have to do our best to help each other especially those who are older and have underlying conditions. For this reason, the Parish Council have discussed how we can help and we've come up with a scheme to try and provide services for those who are not going out.

Firstly, Rowan and her staff are already doing an amazing job at Stanton St John Village Shop trying to source food and other goods and deliver it to local people. Also, Rectory Farm have stepped into the breach and announced they are starting a delivery service. Details are on the reverse.

For anything else, essential shopping, prescriptions, vital lifts, dog walking or just someone to chat to, you can call your street contact or if they are not available, any of the other contacts and they will arrange for someone to help. We have a small group of helpers who are from less vulnerable groups in our community who will pick up shopping or prescriptions. Others are available for a chat if you feel worried or lonely.

The helpers will leave the shopping on your doorstep so to avoid unnecessary contact. Payment for shopping should be done online if possible and organised between you and the helper.

## Stanton St John Village Shop

If you would like a delivery of any of the usual village shop items including fresh Cornfield bread, milk, dairy, fresh soup, newspapers, cakes or baguettes to order (**with no minimum amount**) please phone Rowan on 351532, or email [stantonvillageshop@gmail.com](mailto:stantonvillageshop@gmail.com) or text/Whatsapp on 07795415819. On the first order she needs your name, address and contact number and email address if you use one.

She'll be doing a morning and afternoon delivery in Stanton St John and surrounding villages. All morning goods (newspapers, milk, bread etc) should be ordered by the evening before or 7.30am that morning, latest. If you are after a more substantial delivery, please can she have it by Tuesday midday so she can ensure everything is ordered in for you. If you have papers put aside for you, there is no need to contact her and she will deliver these to you each day.

No minimum order so please treat yourself while this limited service is available – biccies, stuff for dinner, bottle for later ...all brought to your door!

Invoices will be sent/emailed on a two-weekly basis for payment by bank transfer or cheque.

## Rectory Farm

Rectory Farm will be delivering food to Stanton St John every Thursday afternoon. Orders can be made online at [www.rectoryfarmpyo.co.uk/click-and-collect](http://www.rectoryfarmpyo.co.uk/click-and-collect) or on the phone 01865 358309, orders must be placed by Tuesday at midnight online or 6pm on the phone. The minimum spend for this will be £20. They will call each customer to confirm their delivery and take payment over the phone.

If the delivery service is popular they hope to increase this to twice a week. They will also be offering a click and collect service, payment for this will be via card when you come to the shop and orders can be placed at any time for collection 48 hours (or more) later – this will be contact free collection service with customers queuing outside of the shop and their produce brought to them.

## How to protect yourself if you're at high risk

If you're at high risk of getting seriously ill from coronavirus, there are extra things you should do to avoid catching it.

These include:

Not leaving your home – you should not go out to do shopping, pick up medicine or exercise

Stay at least 2 metres (3 steps) away from other people in your home as much as possible

Ask friends, family or neighbours to pick up shopping and medicines for you. They should leave them outside your door.
