The Directors' Report

For the Year Ended 31 March 2014

The Directors' Report and Accounts have been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of the Companies Act relating to small companies. The Directors have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

INCORPORATION/GOVERNING DOCUMENTS

Dornoch and District Community Association was Incorporated on 29 March 2010 as a Company Limited by Guarantee and does not have any Share Capital. The organisation is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The management of the organisation is the responsibility of the Board of Directors who meet regularly. Directors are not remunerated for their work.

The Company is a non-profit making organisation and has Charitable Status.

OBJECTIVES/PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Company objectives are -

- (a) to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Dornoch and District without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, by associating the Local Authorities, Voluntary Organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants, and
- (b) to secure the establishment, maintenance and management of a community centre for activities promoted by the Association in furtherance of the above objects, or any of them.

ACHIEVEMENTS and PERFORMANCE

The principal activity of the Company during the year was the running of the Domoch Social Club. The building continued to be used by various local groups and receipts from the hire of the hall continued to cover the operating expenses.

In addition the Company continued successfully to run:

A Cinema

A Flowers & Fairs group

A Festival Week

A Craft & Guilds Group

A Youth Café

A Book Fair

During the past year DADCA membership has increased, a Tennis Club has been reformed, the Company received the Keystone Quality Award from SCVO and a grant from Big Lottery was confirmed to allow the funding of the Design stage for the Community Centre new build project.

THE TREASURER'S REPORT

All activities achieved a small excess of income over expenditure during the year with the exception of the Cinema which had a small deficit.

The overall result was a surplus of income over expenditure of £6,614, which left all parts of the Company with solid cash balances at the end of the year.

TAXATION STATUS

The company is a recognised charity and as a result there is no liability on the company's income.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The directors have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

RESERVES POLICY

The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity for the medium term and the directors consider the financial position of the charity to be satisfactory.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial position of the organisation is disclosed on the Balance Sheet on page 7. The charity's surplus for the year was £6614 - (2013 £2738)

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The charity will continue to seek ways to become financially self-sufficient in the future.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Dornoch and District Community Association

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2014 which are set out on pages 6 to 10

For the Year Ended 31 March 2014

1 Accounting policies

Basis of Preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Committee Report and all of which are continuing.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice for charity accounts (SORP 2005).

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it qualified as a small charity. The accounts have also been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (2007).

Income

Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received by the charity except when donors specify they should be used in later accounting periods, then the income is deferred.

Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life:-

Computer equipment: 4 years straight line Motor vehicles: 25% reducing balance Other Equipment 5 years straight line

Value added tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

Management and administration expenditure

Expenditure on management and administration of the charity included all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity of fundraising ventures.

Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis.

Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the Community without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor and expenditure that meets these criteria is charged to the fund.
