Structure, governance and management

Dornoch and District Community Association was Incorporated on 29 March 2010 as a Company Limited by Guarantee and does not have any Share Capital. The organisation is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The management of the organisation is the responsibility of the Board of Directors who meet regularly. Directors are not remunerated for their work.

The Company is a non-profit making organisation and has Charitable Status.

Year ended 31 March 2018

Objectives and activities

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

The Company objectives are -

- (a) to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Dornoch religious or other opinions, by associating the Local inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants, and
- (b) to secure the establishment, maintenance and management of a community centre for activities promoted by the Association in furtherance of the above objects, or any of them.

Achievements and performance

The Principal activity of the company during the year was the running of The Dornoch Social Club. The bookings at the hall continue to remain strong with regular events filling the calendar through the year topped up by one off events at weekends for children's parties etc. We also continue to attract new regular bookings including fitness groups being very successful in the start of 2018.

The Car Boot sales and Community Market continue to be a great success and despite lower numbers on the board to volunteer time this has been managed well with the support of DADCA members stepping up to support the board in the running of both these events. Both the Car Boot sales and the Community Market are normally fully subscribed, and with a waiting list on some occasions. The annual Bonfire night was a great success in 2017 with a fantastic turn out from the public resulting in it covering its own cost. All these events are now key in the Dornoch Calendar and attract visitors to the town.

The Board engaged an architect to look at how the current layout of the Social Club could be improved for the current users and to allow us more hireable space. The result was some great outline plans for improvements that could be made should the board feel this would be beneficial. We have paused on this project at the moment due to time constraints on the Chairs for funding applications, and due to two other potential projects in Town. The proposed Curlew Centre and DACICs proposed purchase of the Police station may give us the opportunity to work together on these projects to avoid doubling up and to provide the facilities lacking via these projects.

DADCA continues to seek new directors to join the board to help continue to drive this forward with new ideas, skill and energy.

DADCA continues to be fortunate with great support from our board of volunteers, members, community and local donations such as St Finnbarrs and The RDGC grants and donations to name a few.

Financial review

THE TREASURER'S REPORT

DADCA suffered an overall surplus of £10,267. DADCA's normal activities overall showed a small surplus. The social Club and related fund-raising activities, the Cinema, Flowers and Fairs, Festival Week, Fibre Fest, Youth café and Gallery all generated small surpluses but over half the surplus was due to DADCA taking over the Hogmanay street party together with its cash balance of £5,284. All parts of the company had solid cash balances at the end of the year.

TAXATION STATUS

The company is a recognised charity and as a result there is no liability on the company's income.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The directors have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

RESERVES POLICY

The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity for the medium term and the directors consider the financial position of the charity to be satisfactory.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial position of the organisation is disclosed on the Balance Sheet on page 9. The charity's surplus for the year was £10,267 - (2017 deficit £9,413).

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Dornoch and District Community Association

I report to the trustees on my examination of the financial statements of Dornoch and District Community Association ('the charity') for the year ended 31 March 2018.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 31 March 2018

1. General information

The charity is a private company limited by guarantee and a registered charity in Scotland. The address of the registered office is Dornoch Social Club, School Hill, Dornoch, Sutherland, IV25 3PF, Scotland.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charity Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Transition to FRS 102

The entity transitioned from previous UK GAAP to FRS 102 as at 1 April 2016. Details of how FRS 102 has affected the reported financial position and financial performance is given in note 22.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
 contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
 requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
 it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, noncharitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking
 activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those
 support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable
 activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

Tangible assets (continued)

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, unless it reverses a charge for impairment that has previously been recognised as expenditure within the statement of financial activities. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, except to which it offsets any previous revaluation gain, in which case the loss is shown within other recognised gains and losses on the statement of financial activities.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Motor Vehicles Equipment 25% reducing balance

25% straight line

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.

For impairment testing of goodwill, the goodwill acquired in a business combination is, from the acquisition date, allocated to each of the cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination, irrespective of whether other assets or liabilities of the charity are assigned to those units.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the charity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

Where investments in shares are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably, the investment is subsequently measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in income and expenditure. All other such investments are subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

Financial instruments (continued)

Other financial instruments, including derivatives, are initially recognised at fair value, unless payment for an asset is deferred beyond normal business terms or financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate, in which case the asset is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Other financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, with any changes recognised in the statement of financial activities, with the exception of hedging instruments in a designated hedging relationship.

Financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost are reviewed for objective evidence of impairment at the end of each reporting date. If there is objective evidence of impairment, an impairment loss is recognised under the appropriate heading in the statement of financial activities in which the initial gain was recognised.

For all equity instruments regardless of significance, and other financial assets that are individually significant, these are assessed individually for impairment. Other financial assets are either assessed individually or grouped on the basis of similar credit risk characteristics.

Any reversals of impairment are recognised immediately, to the extent that the reversal does not result in a carrying amount of the financial asset that exceeds what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised.
