REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

The Company objectives are -

- (a) to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Dornoch and District without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, by associating the Local Authorities, Voluntary Organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants, and
- (b) to secure the establishment, maintenance and management of a community centre for activities promoted by the Association in furtherance of the above objects, or any of them.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2021

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities

2020-21 was a quiet year for us due to the pandemic.

Despite the continued restrictions we have had since our last report, we have continued through the efforts of our board and affiliated groups to glean some highlights for some of our regular events for the benefit of our community. Some examples of this are Festival Week who were able to host several events during the week, much to the surprise and delight of our locals and visitors. The community markets were a huge hit, despite the rain and had strong turn outs of both locals and visitors. And Flowers and Fairs who did a wonderful job continuing the legacy of the previous group, involving many members of the community with the Adopt a Pot scheme and making the town look beautiful and welcoming again.

We have been fortunate this year to hold a healthy number on our board of directors and attract new talent to the table. This has given us the opportunity to lessen the workload on some of the directors by appointing new roles and duties more evenly across the committee. We were delighted to appoint Lou Rollanson to the Bookings & Events role which we were able to expand to lessen Kim's never ending list of responsibilities. Lou now not only looks after our minutes and agendas but expertly deals with our bookings, website, social media and enquiries by email and messenger.

We have been fortunate over the past two years, despite the personal sacrifices that have been made by our board members due to the pandemic, in both our careers, businesses and personal lives, to have retained an exceptionally dedicated board of directors. Victoria and I are extremely proud to have held the reins over such a valuable and continuously dedicated board and membership for the past several years. With both of us having now served DADCA for over 10 years, this will be our final year serving on the DADCA board (however you cannot get rid of us, we will be continuing to volunteer in various capacities in the town) The priority of the existing board, as guided by us, will be to ensure our members and community will continue to be served while endeavouring to have a healthy board of directors and seek new members.

As our Treasurer will report separately, our financial position remains healthy, despite Covid-19 and the restrictions put on us, especially due to Lisa Dingwall (Dornoch Bookkeeping) and Gareth Dixon (Treasurer).

I would also like to pay special tributes to:-

All of our sub-committees & hidden volunteers.

My sincere thanks go to everyone who has given freely of their time to help at any of the events organised by any of the committees and organisations, which comprise the Community Association.

The activities of the various sub-committees under the DADCA umbrella are central to the social fabric of Dornoch and all too often their work is taken for granted, but without them Dornoch would be a much poorer place. Additionally, our thanks go to those local businesses who support the various fund raising activities of our sub-committees (in particular Festival Week and Flowers and Fairs), it is very much appreciated.

A special thanks should be given to Frankie Gunn & Scott McCue who give up a huge amount of their time & machinery to help with maintaining and preparing the bonfire each year and putting up the festival week bunting to name but a few things.

Financial Review
THE TREASURER'S REPORT

DADCA suffered a loss of £22,145 which was principally comprised of the use of the whole balance of the John Gordon Trust (£17,844) to refurbish the Social Club plus small losses suffered by DADCA, Fibre Fest and Flowers and Fairs due to a collapse in income due to Covid. However despite these losses, all parts of the Company have healthy cash balances at the end of the year.

TAXATION STATUS

The company is a recognised charity and as a result there is no liability on the company's income.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The directors have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

RESERVES POLICY

The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity for the medium term and the directors consider the financial position of the charity to be satisfactory.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The management of the organisation is the responsibility of the Board of Directors who meet regularly. Directors are not remunerated for their work.

The Company is a non-profit making organisation and has Charitable Status.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
