REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2022

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

The Company objectives are -

- (a) to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Dornoch and District without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, by associating the Local Authorities, Voluntary Organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants, and
- (b) to secure the establishment, maintenance and management of a community centre for activities promoted by the Association in furtherance of the above objects, or any of them.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Principal activity of the company during the year was the running of The Dornoch Social Club. The bookings at the hall continue to remain strong with regular events filling the calendar through the year topped up by one off events at weekends for children's parties etc. We also continue to attract new regular bookings including fitness groups being very successful in the start of 2019.

The Car Boot sales and Community Market continue to be a great success and this has been managed well with the support of DADCA members and community volunteers stepping up to support the board in the running of both these events. Both the Car Boot sales and the Community Market are normally fully subscribed, and with a waiting list on some occasions. After two years running the car boot sale throughout the year every two months, as opposed to every month just through the summer months, this will be reviewed with the regular stall holders to establish which format is best suited and most fruitful for all. The annual Bonfire night was a great success in 2019 with a fantastic turn out from the public resulting in it covering its own cost. This year Carol will pass the running of the Bonfire night to fellow director Victoria Mackenzie who will be supported by the usual volunteers from the board and community. The Hogmanay Street Party (now under the DADCA umbrella) was a huge success drawing a massive following to the town over 2-3 days benefiting local businesses, hotels & B&Bs. All these events are now key in the Dornoch Calendar and attract visitors to the town.

There have been no major works carried out at the social Club building as we continue to await progress on the proposed Curlew Centre and DACICs proposed purchase of the Police station. As a board we have been heavily involved and kept up to date on both projects and how the needs of the current users of the Social Club can be adopted in to both these plans. Should funding for the projects be achieved and the needs of our users are satisfied we will commit our financial support through sale of the Social Club building.

It was a great year welcoming new directors to the board who have all already taken on major roles to support the committee. Of course still DADCA continues to seek new directors to join the board to help continue to drive this forward with new ideas, skill and energy.

DADCA continues to be fortunate with great support from our board of volunteers, members, community and local donations such as St Finnbarrs and The RDGC grants and donations to name a few.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Principal activity of the company during the year was to maintain the running of The Dornoch Social Club. The bookings at the hall at the start of the year continued to remain strong reflecting 2019 bookings with regular events filling the calendar through the year topped up by one off events at weekends. Of course this was suspended when the building was closed under the Scottish Government guidance and lockdown in March 2020.

We have taken the opportunity during this period of closure to make necessary and and essential works to the building to improve the facility when the opportunity to welcome our users back and promote the building to new users. The decision to invest in our building has come on the back of the uncertainty of the other projects in the town going ahead within any reasonable timescale.

All other major events run (and to be run in 2020) have of course been cancelled due to the size and attendance of such events. However we will take the opportunity to put on or arrange alternate events in place of these where government regulations allow.

The accounts continue to remain in a strong position despite no income and we look forward to welcoming back users and the revenue they bring to the charity as soon as is safe. The board remains strong in numbers and we have created roles within the board to share the volunteering load which has made us considerably more efficient and productive.

DADCA continues to be fortunate with great support from our board of volunteers, members, community and local donations such as St Finnbarrs and The RDGC grants and donations to name a few.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial Review

THE TREASURER'S REPORT

DADCA achieved an overall surplus of £8,056. Flowers and Fairs suffered a small deficit during the year, but all other activities achieved small surpluses. All parts of the Company had solid cash balances at the end of the year.

TAXATION STATUS

The company is a recognised charity and as a result there is no liability on the company's income.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The directors actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The directors have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

RESERVES POLICY

The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity for the medium term and the directors consider the financial position of the charity to be satisfactory.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The management of the organisation is the responsibility of the Board of Directors who meet regularly. Directors are not remunerated for their work.

The Company is a non-profit making organisation and has Charitable Status.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF DORNOCH AND DISTRICT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Dornoch and District Community Association ('the Company')

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2022

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
