

Minutes of the meeting of Dinnington Parish Council held on Wednesday 18 June 2025 at 6.30 pm.

17.	Apologies for Absence Apologies were received from Cllrs McKenna and Phelps.	
18.	Declarations of Interest The Chair reminded members to declare any interests as they arose.	
19.	Minutes of previous meeting RESOLVED that the minutes of the annual meeting of the Parish Council held on 21 May 2025 be agreed as a true record.	
20.	Matters Arising Cllr Wood reported as follows:  Permissive footpath in the field from Gardners Houses entrance to connect up with the wooded section - a meeting had been held with Will Todd (Blagdon Estates) on site to discuss the problems with providing a fence along the route of the section of permissive path. He agreed to take this back to Blagdon Estates to see if the requirement for a fence could be reconsidered.  The overgrown condition of the existing Public Right of Way path had also been looked at. He had confirmed he would get Blagdon Estates to carry out the work they were obliged to do, but asked if Cllr Wood could contact NCC Rights of Way officer to see if they could assist. NCC had put it on the list to be strimmed in the next couple of months. Blagdon Estates would then carry out their work following this.  The old furniture piled up next to the flats adjacent to Poplar Avenue had been removed.  Cllr Toward Wright reported that the conifer cuttings had been collected and an update on the crash barrier had been submitted.  Only two member photos had been submitted so far.	
21.	Kingston Park Bus Service  Cllr Wood reported that Cllr Phelps had advised that the next Airport meeting, where this item could be raised, was not until early July.  However, he had confirmed that the Airport were going out shortly for a consultation on their proposed new Masterplan, specifically on transport links to the airport. This could present an opportunity to get over the PC's
