79.	Declarations of Interest The Chair reminded members to declare any interests as they arose.	
80.	Recreation Ground Update Noel Hanlon and Allison McLeod attended for this item and gave a presentation on the Preferred Design Option. The design had been reviewed by the British Cycling and Sport England Consultant who had provided some feedback, suggestions for layout reconfiguration taking into account communities preferences for provision, high level costings and potential funding streams. Work on the play park was expected to complete in late Spring. He also outlined options for inclusion in a wider Playzone application which could be investigated further after the play park work was completed. Members made suggestions about a slightly revised location for the equipment to the other side of the MUGA. A bollard had been temporarily installed at the entrance to the car park, and would be permanently installed once keys had been cut for it. Allison would send a copy of the presentation and a firm timescale for completion of the project.

89. Updates

Persimmon Homes - 13 plots were reserved, 173 plots were legally completed / occupied, 11 were nearing completion and 5 plots were for sale. They now had only 10 or so plots only to complete the development.

Village Hall – a cleaner was now in place 4 hours per week and a local person had agreed to continue as a volunteer. Hall opening was being done on a rota basis and Doreen the playgroup leader was thanked for her help in providing cover. New LED lights had been fitted.

Newsletter – this would be delivered w/c 28 November 2022. Suggestions were made for content, including reminder to cut hedges overhanging paths etc.

Library - Nothing to report

Allotments – the annual meeting had taken place on Monday evening which Allison McLeod had attended to show the plans of the new allotments. There were currently 43 people on the waiting list for an allotment. It was **agreed** that the bill for the next tranche of design fees for the allotments would be paid, should it be submitted soon.

Development of field adjacent to the allotments known as the Pleasure Grounds to facilitate additional Allotments – a meeting had been held with Allotment Holders on Monday night to consult on proposals and gather feedback.
