149.	Apologies for Absence Cllrs Phelps and Laverick (NCC).	
150.	Declarations of Interest The Chair reminded members to declare any interests as they arose.	
151.	Police Report PCSOs Paul Mood and Vickie Brown were present. There had been five incidents since their last report, mostly domestic issues. There had been no actual crimes. With regard to Cllr Toward Wright's request for a speed camera van presence, these would only normally be deployed where there had been casualties or high accident rates. Cllr Toward Wright asked if they were used after dark, PCSO Moody would check this out and report back.	
152.	Minutes of previous meeting RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council held on 18 January 20923 be agreed as a true record.	
153.	 Cllr Porter reported that there were no plans to install a cash machine at the post office, but they had suggested the newsagents. This was being considered but it would need to be outside the shop. The post office should re-open Mon-Fri if the required training took place. It was currently open Mon-Wed. The Chair reported that he needed to get further information and go back to YHN on the issues relating to their responsibilities. The signs were now back up at Brunswick junction. Cllr Avaei would speak to Cllr Campion regarding the issues raised under Minute No. 135. Woodburners – Cllr Avaei would raise a new action on this. Cllr Toward Wright – her potholes report had now been open for two months with no update. No update on the dog fouling report but the fly tipping issue had been sorted. She would email Cllr Avaei regarding the outstanding matters. Cllr Dellow reported that she had spoken to NCC regarding the fly tipping on the Carr Road. 154.	Bus Services Services appeared to have returned almost to normal. This could now be removed from the agenda.	
155.	Coronation Event Members had some initial discussions about events and it was agreed that this would be an agenda item for the next meeting.	
156.	Signed Minutes The current signed minute book was with the Clerk. There were also minutes in the filing cabinet in the cupboard and a check needed to be made to ensure that there was no gap between the two sets of records. Then a deposit could be made with Archives.	Chair/Clerk

	Tree replacement and maintenance programme The 18 new trees had been approved by NECF and would be planted late Feb / March.	
	A new village map Awaiting Persimmon completion and updating of the OS map database, before proceeding. It was suggested that the new map should be deferred until the GP surgery had been built and then a more detailed map be sourced. This was agreed.	
	Additional litterbins Awaiting feedback from Cllr Laverick / Your Local Services about whether additional bins could now be requested from NCC, before this could be resolved.	
	Possible additional grass cuts If the need arises.	
	Turn the area of the Old School Field remaining after construction of the Doctors into a small simple park. Further positive discussions had been held with NCC properties, however this could not proceed much further until the Doctors' land purchase had been finalised.	
	Speed Reduction to 20mph on Main Road. The initial design from NCC for a traffic calming scheme for the village was still awaited. They would forward a plan and budget estimate in due course and the PC could then decide how to proceed from there.	
	Money towards New play park equipment in recreation ground, an additional footpath in recreation ground, between Sycamore Ave and Sheraton Park adjacent to the school The available funding has been confirmed by NCC as £187,028.75. Costs have been returned from NCC highways, which were near enough within budget. The scheme would proceed on the basis of delivering the fenced play area as priority over the obstacle course and look to programme for installation in Spring.	
	Improvements to Footpath down to Big Waters	

The survey work was complete, proposal options drawn up and priced. Allison would aim to pull this together and get information over to the PC in March.

Electronic Traffic Speed signs in the Village

New signs on Front Street on the north side of the road - The signs were still held up in manufacturing due to a software issue, but hopefully would be delivered to NCC later this week and installed soon after.

158. Updates

Persimmon Homes - They had 189 plots completed, 5 plots for sale and 7 plots reserved / exchanged. They were now almost complete. The play area at the front of the estate had now been installed.

Village Hall – Cllr Porter reported that a new yoga class was starting in March and had booked a number of taster sessions. Warm Zone was proving popular and was attracting people who didn't usually attend other groups, which was welcomed.

Allotments – the hedge had been cut.

Newsletter - Nothing to report

Library – On 22 July, the library would have been going for 10 years and they were considering an event to mark the occasion. Jellytots playgroup had begun visiting the library with 2 or 3 children at a time on Wednesday mornings.

Development of field adjacent to the allotments known as the Pleasure Grounds to facilitate additional Allotments

The work was ongoing with the Planning Application & Design and Access Statement. Again, there was a major slip on timescale with submission likely to be end of March now.

Website - Nothing to report

Dinnington Surgery - Argon Health were continuing discussions with NCC planning, with the programme being to obtain planning permission in the next couple of months and hopefully complete the works by summer 2024. They were now working with a Highways consultant to finalise their entrance details.

The Pharmacy had obtained planning permission, so could proceed to carry out their security / building work improvements and prepare to open.

159. Neighbourhood Plan

Argon Health had been in touch with both NCC and the PC to advise that they may need slightly more land to accommodate their development. This was an issue as it was at variance with the area submitted by them for the NP. The plan may have to be amended to deal with this. Discussions were underway with NCC as to the best way forward, so as not to preclude the Doctors surgery from progressing and at the same time allow the finalisation of the NP. It was possible that the NP may need to be
