Operation Paramount – Road Traffic Matters

Throughout March we have carried out speed checks at Arncroach, St Monans, Cellardyke, Pittenweem, Crail and Kingsbarns resulting in 30 drivers being warned, 3 drivers receiving conditional offers/fixed penalty tickets and 1 driver being reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

Crail Raceway hosted another 'Thrash' event on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> March, both community and road traffic officers were deployed in the local area to carry out speed checks and provide reassurance to the public. The event was very well attended and culminated without any incidents.

Road Safety remains one of our top priorities and officers will continue to carry out high visibility stop points and speed gun deployments throughout the year to ensure we keep our communities safe.

Community Engagement

PC's Cook, Wallace and Fisher attended at Waid Academy in Anstruther to provide support for a Violence Reduction Workshop event which was organised by Depute Rector Mr Kowbel. Officer's spoke to S1, S2 and S3 pupils in relation to violence both within and out-with school and gave advice on how to behave as a responsible person. Waterside Responder Scheme

PC's Cook and Wallace attended at RNLI Station in Anstruther to take part in the Waterside Responder Training Scheme. This is a programme which aims to equip people who work near to water with the knowledge and skills to be confident to undertake action to save a life. Each year around 96 people die in and around water in Scotland through accidental and natural causes, it's estimated that a large percentage of those who lose their lives in water die before the alarm is raised. ### Theft of Motor Vehicles

Police Scotland continue to see vehicles being stolen throughout North East Fife and Leven, with areas such as Newport, St Andrews and Crail recently targeted. Earlier this month we saw two Volkswagens taken from one address in St Andrews and more recently an Audi S3 stolen from Crail (which has since been recovered). Extensive stop points have been in place and supported by Roads Policing ensuring that we were consistently patrolling the main routes from North East Fife into Leven, as a result two males have been arrested and have appeared at court. We would encourage that residents protect your high valued assets - secure your car keys by keeping them away from entrance doors and windows, place all car keys within an Anti-Theft Car key signal blocker pouch, make use of steering wheel locks, house alarms and CCTV systems. Community Officers can visit anyone with concerns or queries on security if required, or speak to us at Local Community Meetings.
