November also saw a total of 548 call to the police across our area. 18 of these calls were reports of a burglary, 7 reports of theft from a motor vehicle, 117 call were regarding an incidents on our road network and 75 calls were to report a concern for the safety of someone. Unfortunately 11 calls were recorded as hoax calls on our area. These type of calls always have an impact on police resources and in such a busy month, was an additional work load we didn't need!

YOU SAID, WE DID:

GROBY – Parking issues reported on Ratby Road. A meeting has been held at County Hall with the Parish Council to explore options around improving this situation. We are also actively monitoring the area and will deal with offending vehicles robustly.

STOKE GOLDING & HIGHAM ON THE HILL – Reports of speeding vehicles through the villages. Our volunteers have been out to Higham on the Hill and monitored 12 vehicles passing through the area at speed. Letters have been sent to the owners of these vehicles. A similar day of action is planned for Stoke Golding in the coming weeks.

NEWBOLD VERDON – Reports of anti-social behaviour and drug use in the area with a focus on the pavilion. We have increased our patrols in this area resulting in some individuals being stopped and searched and a quantity of drugs being seized. We have also as a result of intelligence conducted a warrant at an address in the area where cannabis was found to be growing. We will continue to patrol this area and deal with offenders accordingly.
