In focus: Transforming travel in Mendip

The Council is aiming to make it easier and safer for residents to travel by bike and on foot. It wants to reconnect people and places through a network of cycle and walking paths across the district.

The ambitious project delivers on the Council's priorities for a greener, fairer, more vibrant Mendip - and its aim to be carbon neutral by 2030. It also taps-in to the recent surge in walking and cycling rates since the Coronavirus crisis, and the reluctance of some to return to public transport until a vaccine is found.

Leader of Mendip District Council, Cllr Ros Wyke, was invited to appear on BBC Radio Somerset's popular breakfast show to explain the Council's plan in more detail.

A new dairy response fund will open for applications on 18 June. Qualifying farmers can apply for support to cover up to 70% of their losses due to coronavirus disruption across April and May, up to a total amount of £10,000 each. The funding will be paid out from 6 July.

Health Matters

Regional R rates explained

The reproductive (R) value tells us how many people a person with the virus is expected to infect and gives an indication of whether the epidemic is getting bigger or smaller.

An R value of below 1 suggests cases are decreasing, whilst an R value above 1 suggests the number of infections are increasing.

The latest information suggests the R value for the South West is estimated to be around 1.

The R value only tells us whether an epidemic is getting bigger or smaller and should never be looked at in isolation. In Somerset we still have low numbers of cases, although there is some suggestion this is increasing.

There will be times when numbers in Somerset will rise and fall; the easing of lockdown and other factors will contribute to this. This is a stark reminder that the coronavirus pandemic has not gone away.

Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed Coronavirus (COVID-19) infection

The most important symptoms of Coronavirus are recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people it will be a mild illness. However, if you have any of the symptoms above you must stay at home and arrange to have a test to see if you have COVID-19.

NHS Test and Trace

The NHS Test and Trace service was launched nationally on Thursday 28th May. The service will help to identify people with coronavirus and their contacts, helping us to reduce the spread of the virus and save lives.

Testing is now available for anyone who develops the symptoms of coronavirus through the NHS website or by dialling 119. Anyone who receives a positive test result will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace to find out about their recent interactions and who they have been in close contact with. Then, if necessary, the people they have been in close contact with will be notified and given guidance on self-isolation and staying at home to help stop the spread of the virus.
