Help for the high streets as Mendip reopens

Non-essential shops are now open, but they must follow government guidelines to keep staff and customers as safe as possible.

If you go shopping, here's what you can do:

- Plan your journey and cycle or walk if you can.
- Social-distance (2m apart) and wear a face covering when inside if possible.
- Give yourself time – there will be limits on numbers in shops and queues.
- Shop with patience and follow the guidance in shops.
- Only touch the items you are going to buy where possible.
- If you can, make payments with cards or contactless payment.
- Carry a hand sanitiser with you, and wash your hands when you get home.
- Dispose of your rubbish carefully (especially any gloves or masks, if you choose to wear these - they should not be placed in recycling bins as they cannot be recycled through conventional facilities).

What your Council is doing:

- Making it easier for the public to use active travel to move around Mendip.
- Spacing out market stalls to ensure social distancing.
- Suspending car parking fees.
- Encouraging the public to think about how they travel to shops and the way they shop, to reduce the spread of coronavirus.
- Installing social distancing signage, posters and barriers around retail areas.

You must not change your support bubble. If anyone in the bubble develops symptoms of coronavirus you must all self-isolate for 14 days.

In focus: Reopening our High Streets

Mendip District Council has been supporting local businesses as high streets open this week. Residents are being encouraged back too, with the promise of safe town centres – and no car parking charges.

In its commitment to supporting the recovery of the local economy, all Mendip-operated pay and display car parks will remain free for the foreseeable future. (Somerset County Council's civil enforcement officers returned to work on June 1st – residents please note when parking on roads, highways and pavements).

Mendip has also announced that market stallholders will pay no rent throughout June and July. And the Council was delighted to see Wells Market re-open on Wednesday 10th June, with some really positive feedback about the methods deployed to ensure staff, trader and public safety. There were 40+ traders in the city, able to provide goods to the public, mostly with a food theme. Although it was a quiet day of trading, the return was very well received. Both Frome and Wells operated on Saturday, June 13th too.

In the run-up to reopening, the Council has been busy offering businesses advice on safety issues, social distancing and signage, using monies provided by the European Regional Development Fund for Reopening High Streets Safely.

Changes to travel have been implemented for this week's opening of non-essential traders, to allow for the widening of pavements outside shops and to promote more walking and cycling commutes. The Council made these arrangements working with Somerset County Council using emergency funding from the Government's Active Travel Fund.

Reopening: Changes to travel

Some of the key travel measures which will be prioritised for delivery over the next fortnight include:

Mendip	Frome	Providing access only to the Market Place from 22 June to enable Market Place improvement works with car parks remaining open.
Mendip	Street	Temporarily pedestrianise (with delivery vehicle access only) High Street from Leigh Road to Vestry Road (where market normally takes place).
Mendip	Wells	Wells City Council requested no changes to highways - to be reviewed next week.
Mendip	Glastonbury	Temporarily pedestrianise (with delivery and bus access only) High Street, Magdalene Street and Benedict Street.
Mendip	Shepton Mallet	Consideration being given to the temporary pedestrianisation (with delivery access only) of High Street from Market Cross (where the market usually takes place) to Park Road Roundabout from 18 June.
Mendip	Wells to Glastonbury lane	Temporary closure (with residential / farm access only) of Long Drove following existing cycle route to facilitate safer cycling between the towns and support social distancing on public transport (Glastonbury – Wells bus service).

Drivers are reminded of the need to remain alert for more cyclists and pedestrians in all areas but particularly near shops as the lockdown continues to ease.

Recovery: Grants, funding and freebies

Mendip businesses receive £27 million from Council as region reopens

The District Council has issued £27 million to more than 2,274 eligible local businesses in a bid to get Mendip moving again after lockdown.

Local Authority Discretionary Grants ‘closed’ and payments starting

We are now prioritising and checking these applications and we are starting to process payments this week. These will be processed in batches, so businesses will not receive the payments at the same time. Dairy response fund

A new dairy response fund will open for applications on 18th June. Qualifying farmers can apply for support to cover up to 70% of their losses due to coronavirus disruption across April and May, up to a total amount of £10,000 each. The funding will be paid out from 6 July.

NEW! Sport England Inequalities Fund

Somerset Activity and Sports Partnership (SASP), have received funding from Sport England to help keep people most affected during this pandemic physically active, or ready to get or resume activity.

The Inequalities Funding aims to support targeted groups across Somerset with a simple and quick expression of interest. These groups are:

- People from Lower Socio Economic Groups
- Black, Asian, Minority Ethnic Communities
- Disabled People
- People with Long Term Health Conditions

They anticipate projects to be valued between £200 and £2,000. Larger projects will be considered where the impact justifies it. Expressions of Interest will be reviewed within a two week period.
