Recycle More in Mendip

Recycle More details have been sent to all homes across Mendip.

A bright blue bag for plastic, aerosols, tins, cans and foil should have been delivered to every NW household. The new service commenced on 28 October for NW with extra materials taken every week:

- Household and food plastic pots, tubs and trays
- Cartons/Tetra Paks
- Small household batteries
- Small electrical items

Dulcote Recycling Site remains open and **all materials are now being taken**, although “shop-style” safety restrictions remain. Expect long delays; only visit if really necessary.

The site will be open six days a week:

- 9am-5pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays (closed Tuesdays)
- 9am-4pm Saturdays and Sundays,

Access is "one in, one out".

Library Services

Somerset Libraries key services are remaining in place during the lockdown period.

“Library choice” service and the reservation service for specific requests will continue to be available but customers will no longer be able to browse shelves. Limited access to the people’s network computers which will be available for essential users.

The “Library choice” service enables you to request up to ten books hand-picked by a member of staff based on your favourite genres or authors. Simply complete the request form on the Somerset Libraries website, or in person at the library, and staff will be in touch regarding your selections. Alternatively, if you want to borrow a particular title then you can still use the reservation system via www.LibrariesWest.org.uk (charges may apply).

From Thursday 5 November, all items already on loan or items borrowed during lockdown will not be due back any earlier than the 14 December. Library staff can offer a longer loan period if required, and all loans can be renewed online or by contacting libraiesmail@somerset.gov.uk or tel: 0300 123 2224.

The excellent online offer continues, so that library members can download books, audiobooks, magazines, newspapers and comics free of charge. Regular online events and updates will be posted across the Somerset Libraries social media pages. North Wootton Parish Council News

November 2020

North Wootton Parish Council (NWPC) continues to operate under the emergency arrangements agreed earlier in the year, with meetings being held online via Zoom, and simultaneous live streaming also available on YouTube. As we found with our last meeting on 17th November, technical problems can make online meetings rather difficult. However, one advantage is that the live-streamed version stays on YouTube should any of you want to catch up with what happened. Simply put 'North Wootton Parish Council' into YouTube's search engine and you'll find a list of all our streamed meetings this year.

Issues discussed on 17th November included a report from our Mendip District Council (MDC) representative, Councillor Nigel Hewitt-Cooper, who briefed us on current delays in the approval of some planning applications as a result of an as yet unresolved issue raised by the Environment Agency about phosphate contamination on the Levels. Interested villagers can find further details on the MDC website. He also asked how the village was finding the new recycling arrangements – councillors felt that generally the response to the changes has been positive – and updated us on plans for more affordable housing.

In a majority decision, councillors decided not to recommend approval of a planning application to add washroom and drainage facilities to enable use as a caravan and motorhome park of the site along Lower Westholme Road where a stable block and fencing were approved last year. Councillors were concerned that the stabling has not been constructed as originally approved and, had they been asked to consider it, they would not have recommended approval of the proposed caravan and motorhome park.

As mentioned last month, an important issue at this meeting was to set a budget for next year. In addition to the usual routine expenses, councillors agree to budget for an increased grant to the Village Hall to compensate for their loss of revenue due to Covid-19 and continuation of the programme of repairs to finger posts. Despite these additions, the Parish Precept (the amount included in our Council Tax bills to meet NWPC's costs) will be less next year. A final version of the budget will be agreed at the next meeting in January.

Councillors heard the usual reports from their colleagues with specific responsibilities for roads, footpaths and moors and levels matters. Highlights included the state of New Road, various roads subject to flooding after heavy rain and a number of footpath issues. Batts Bridge, the old, stone footbridge over the River Redlake near the church, was recently inspected by Somerset County Council and we await their formal report. The bridge is listed so any repairs will require Listed Building Consent. Villagers were reminded to inform Councillor Hoddinott, the councillor who looks after footpaths, about any damaged stiles or other footpath issues.

Councillors also had a preliminary discussion about national plans to update the official map identifying footpaths. Whilst the exercise does not have to be completed for several years, it was agreed that the sooner work started to agree which footpaths we wish to retain the better, particularly as there are a number of informal paths in the village which are not included on the current official map.

As usual, formal minutes of our November meeting and other useful information (including this edition of North Wootton News and the continuing MDC bulletins on Covid-19 matters) will be posted on NWPC's website at: www.northwoottonparishcouncil.org.uk.

The next currently planned meeting will be held online at 7.30 pm on Tuesday 19th January 2021.
