Instructions: Follow the map -if you like- and answer the question for as many or few stops as you would like to attempt. You must turn in your answers before 30 October to receive a candy prize. The more correct answers you give, the bigger your bag of candy will be!

Note for participants and parents: Our map and stop order is a suggestion for your convenience only. You can complete as many stops as you like in any order. Our suggested path is over 3 miles long and utilizes foot and bridle paths; wellies strongly advised. Whether you follow our path or your own - all answers should be ascertained from the public pavement with the exception of Stops 3 and 16, as noted in the clues. Please do not ask any of the host stop residents for assistance. Our host stops are making best efforts to keep their decorations visible for the duration of the activity, but weather and other forces can interfere. The "judging" of answers will recognise that, so do not worry if you cannot complete a stop, jot down your attempt and have fun!



Stop 1: Home Close, Green Lane Sometimes odds can be tricky, it's harder to share. Good thing that these beings came just in a pair! What Halloween object do you spot only two of at Home Close?



Stop 2: Croyland, Huntingdon Road In a web by the door, its body so bright - we're sure we could find it, even by night! What is in the web by the door, and what colour is it?



Stop 3: #3a, Rectory Lane For a view of the porch, step on to the drive - what Halloween vision then meets your eye? Walk on to the drive to where you can see the front porch, and then write down one Halloween decoration that you see.



Stop 4: Waterside, Splash Lane

This stop is a new house, but it's not hard to find- does anything here put Halloween on your mind? Name one Halloween decoration that you see at Waterside.



Stop 5: #16, Manor Close Ooh this is a thing that could give you a scare, what type of creature floats behind the "BEWARE"? What is in the front window of 16 Manor Road?



Stop 6: #9, St. Margarets Road Now here at our next stop, you have loads of time - so take a good gander, then write which words rhyme. Write all the words from the window that rhyme- and can you think of any others?



Stop 7: #39, St. Margarets Road They like to cast spells, they love their black cats, and now they've gone off and left us their hats! What type of beings left their hats at 39 St. Margarets Road, and how many were there?



Stop 8: #43, St. Margarets Road These skulls are not black or white, like you'd think - instead for *three* here, the colour is



Stop 9: #48, St. Margarets Road Is it four, is it more, is it one, is it two? How many ghosts in this window say "Boo"?



Stop 10: #48, Huntingdon Road The spiders at this house have something to show - we almost mistook them for a pretty rainbow! What colour legs do the spiders in the window at #48 Huntingdon Road Have?



Stop 11: #3, Warren Close This could be easy, or maybe quite hard - but how many skeletons do you see here on guard? How many skeletons do you see at #3 Warren Close?



Stop 12: #24, Warren Close Oh what have we here, it's such a fun place! But we want you to look for just one type of face. How many pumpkins can you spot at #24 Warren Close?



Stop 13: #60, Victoria Crescent We're looking for what flies in front of the moon - we'll give you a hint, it's not a balloon. What flying creature do you see in the window, and how many are there?



Stop 14: Sunnymeade, St. Ives Road The dark can be scary - things go
"BUMP" in the night! Good thing THESE
are here, to give us some light. How many
Halloween lanterns can you count in front of the
garage at Sunnymeade?



Stop 15: Manor Cottage, St. Ives Road It isn't hello, it isn't goodbye - what words do the tombstone suggest that

you try? What greeting is written on the tombstone in the window of Manor Cottage?



Stop 16: Green Garth, The Lanes Sometimes they're frowning, sometimes they're smiling, whatever they do they're always beguiling! How many pumpkin heads are in the window at Green Garth? You may walk on to the driveway to see.



Stop 17: #7, Leslie Green Something conspired to give them a chase- please can you tell me the bats' old resting place? From where are the bats flying away in the window at #7 Leslie Green?



Stop 18: #35, Brookside These creatures are cunning and like a dark place, they boast many legs and move at fast pace. What type of creature do you see at #35 Brookside?



Stop 19: The Spinney, Meadow Lane They fly and they hover, through the night sky they sail, they dip in and out and they eerily wail. There are some spooky beings at the Spinney - what are they?



Stop 20: The Cedars, The Thicket Snowy and white, and made with such grace, this sticky stuff looks just like lace. What covers the fence at The Cedars?



Stop 21: Old School House, Mill Street Now that we've neared the end of Mill Street - can you see what the bats here are wanting to eat? Look at the window by the side gate to answer the clue.



Stop 22: White Gables, Chapel Lane Ahh, you've reached White Gables, and now that you're here - what can you see only this time of year? Name one Halloween decoration that you see in a window at White Gables.



Stop 23: #5 West End Cottage, Huntingdon Road Alas... we've come to the end and the hour is late - if we add skulls to pumpkins, the number is eight. How many skulls are there in the window? How many pumpkins?

- Begin outside the drive of Stop 1: Home Close, Green Lane. Proceed to the immediate corner at Huntingdon Road, and turn left/west. Stop 2, Croyland, is on your left.
- Continue straight/west along Huntingdon Road, and turn left/south on Rectory Lane to Stop 3, #3a Rectory Lane.
- Backtrack to Huntingdon Road, and turn left/west, then continue until you see Stop 4, the new property Waterside (this is before you come to the automotive turnoffs for the A1123). Safely cross the street.
- Return toward the village centre along Huntingdon Road, turning left/north on Manor Close and follow it to Stop 5 at #16 Manor Close. Return to Huntingdon Road, turning left/east toward the village centre.
- Turn left/north on St. Margarets Road to complete Stops 6 through 9.
- Return to Huntingdon Road, and turn left/east toward the village centre, pausing at Stop 10 (#48 Huntingdon Road). Continue on toward the village centre.
- Turn left/north on Ware Lane and follow it until you reach Warren Close. Circle the close for stops 11 & 12, then follow Ware Lane back to Huntingdon Road. Turn left/east toward the village centre until you reach Victoria Crescent.
- Turn left/north on Victoria Crescent, follow it to #60 (Stop 13). Continue along Victoria Crescent until it takes a turn to the south, and before it does, take the pedestrian path to the playing field, all the way to the playing field parking lot.
- Continue through the parking lot to St. Ives Road, turn right/south toward the village centre. View stop #14, Sunnymeade, on your right. Safely cross the street and continue on St. Ives Road toward the village centre.
- Just before the corner of Farm Close you will reach Stop #15, Manor Cottage.
- Continue toward the village centre, turning left/east on The Lanes. At the end of the paved road, pause to view Stop 16, Green Garth. Continue ahead-left/north along the footpath until you reach an intersection and turn right/southeast, leading out on to Home Farm Road.
- Turn right/southeast on Home Farm Road.
- Turn left/north on Brookside.
- Turn left/northwest on Leslie Green. Go to the end to view Stop 17. As you face Stop 17, there is a small footpath to your right/northeast take that to the bridle path (unmarked as Meadow Lane), turn right/southwest, and come again to Brookside.
- Turn left/northeast on Brookside, and go to Stop 18, #35 Brookside. Then backtrack on Brookside to the bridle path and turn left/southeast.
- Follow the bridle path to the road Home Farm Road.
- Turn right/west on Home farm Road and take an immediate left/southeast on Ansley Road. Continue to the end and take the limited road/footpath. Immediately you reach an intersection: left directs you with signage toward Meadow Lane. Go left and follow to the end, finding Stop 19, The Spinney.
- Backtrack along the limited road/footpath until you come back to the intersection at Ansley Road. This time, take the other fork on the footpath. Continue until you reach another intersection, which is Thicket Path.
- Turn right/west on the Thicket, toward the village centre (away from St. Ives). Continue to Stop 20, The Cedars.
- Continue toward the village centre along the Thicket until the next public footpath junction (Rose Cottage is on your right, The Gardens is on your left). Turn left/south on the public footpath, follow it until you come out on Mill Street.
- Turn left/south on to Mill Street and continue away from the village centre to Stop 21: Old School House, Mill Street.
- Cross (west) the Church yard to Chapel Lane.
- Turn right/north on Chapel Lane to find Stop 22: White Gables, Chapel Lane.
- Continue on Chapel Lane to the village centre. With the Shop on your left, continue (north) along Huntingdon Road to final Stop 23: #5 West End Cottage.
