- 1] ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN for 2016-17 Coun. Mike Sheriston was elected.
- 2] ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN 2016-17 Coun. Richard Whitby was elected.

- 4] DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST There were none
- 5] MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING MARCH 9 2016 were accepted as presented and signed by the chairman
- 6] CLERK'S REPORT
The seat at the A606 road garage had been placed in position.
The interactive speed sign on A606 road is now working.
- 7] CORRESPONDENCE
Notts CPRE are asking all parish councils to consider entering the 2016 Best Kept Village competition. Entries close on the 25th May. Members discussed the matter and agreed to enter, and to publicise the fact in the next newsletter.
- 8] PLANNING MATTERS
Rushcliffe Borough Council planning applications

- 9] VILLAGE AMENITIES / ENVIRONMENT
The council agree to offer the Queen's 90th birthday medals to all youngsters in the parish aged 16 and under and anyone aged 90 years, with the qualifying date being April 21. It was agreed that Coun. Mrs Whitby produce an application form and circulate this with the next newsletter. Closing date for applications, which would be sent to the clerk, would be July 13. It was suggested the members would distribute the medals. Coun. Goodman raised the question of a missing footpath stile off Stanton Lane and it was agreed the clerk advise Notts County Council of this, as well as of a damaged stile on land owned by Mr Eric Elliott. Concerns were expressed at the poor appearance of two grey post boxes sited on Browns Lane and Stanton Lane and originally used to store extra mail for postmen but which since the introduction of vehicles for all operatives were not used. The clerk was to ask for their removal. There was also need for the red post box to be repainted.
The clerk was to ask Rushcliffe Borough Council if it could supply anti-litter signs.
