## Lesnewth Parish Meeting – 13<sup>th</sup> July 2022.

2022/7 110	To <b>RECEIVE</b> a report from Cllr. Jordan: Due to incapacity, Cllr Jordan was unable to attend.
2022/7 111	<b>Minutes of the meeting held on 19<sup>th</sup> May 2022:</b> For the benefit of new members of the community, the Minutes of the meeting, held on the above date, were read out by the Clerk. It was agreed by those present who had attended the meeting, that these Minutes were a true record of the business conducted. These Minutes were signed by the Chairman.
2022/7 112	<b>Planning Applications for consultation:</b> None at this time.
2022/7 113	It was <b>RESOLVED</b> to adopt the Finance report presented which showed a balance of £2229.22 with no movement since the last meeting. Agreed unanimously and signed by the Chairman.
2022/7 114	It was <b>agreed</b> by all that a defibrillator be purchased and installed in Lesnewth. Simon McNair-Scott and the Clerk to liaise on the purchase and installation.
2022/7 115	<b>Coffin Stile:</b> Concern was expressed over the future well-being of this Grade 2 listed structure as the roots of a large, mature oak tree, growing above it, were feared likely to cause damage to the fabric of the seats on either side of the coffin stile. It was noted that the ownership of the land upon which the stile is sited was in question. It was therefore decided that the Chairman and Rev. Aston would hold further conversation with the Diocese to investigate the tree's potential to cause damage to the stile and its surroundings.
2022/7 116	<b>Trees on Church land:</b> It had been noted that several trees within the churchyard were showing signs of 'die back' on their upper limbs. It was agreed that the Arboriculturist appointed by the Diocese should be asked to assess the condition of the trees.
2022/7 117	<b>Parish Maintenance:</b> It was suggested that the road from Lesnewth to Trewold needs to be swept clear of leaves and debris left by Winter storms. It was further suggested that better safety signage be put in place at the 'T' junction (turning left for Lesnewth at Penpol) It would help with on-line orders and deliveries if a street name could be assigned to the road running

through Lesnewth, currently known as 'the road from Minster to Tregatherall Lane'.

S. Tizzard suggested the community of Lesnewth might benefit from a bespoke communication provision as the current Broadband present in Lesnewth was, at best, slow and unreliable. Further investigation, and community engagement needed.
