4.	<ul> <li>Matters Arising:</li> <li>Pavements Opposite the Rugby Club: SBC are to provide dropped kerbs.</li> <li>Boat Brae Rubbish Bin: TM will take this up with SBC.</li> <li>Christmas Lights: RC and GB have produced a specification for the replacement timers and new garlands and prices are being sought.</li> <li>Market Square Electricity: GB has agreed with the traders that the costs will be split 50/50 between themselves and the Community Council.</li> <li>Golf Club Drainage Problem: SBC will check the gullies. There is possibly a problem for Scottish Water to address.</li> <li>Melrose Station Banner: A member of the group who had put up the sign had contacted the Community Council. 	<ul> <li>Chiefswood Road One-Way Proposal: TM, JL and DP will deliver a newsletter on the limited May to September one-way system to all houses affected. The road will revert to two way traffic after 30 September. Figures on actual usage by cyclists and pedestrians over the summer will be used to build a business case for the creation of a separate path at the side of Chiefswood Road. SBC will draw up detailed plans and costs, and funding will be sought from SUSTRANS.</li> <li>Speeding on A6091: The situation with cars speeding on the A6091 appears to be getting worse.
