On Tuesday, June 15, the Diocese of Truro will be hosting an Online Missional Communities seminar, exploring the possibilities for building missional Christian communities that move freely between the online space and physical shared life.

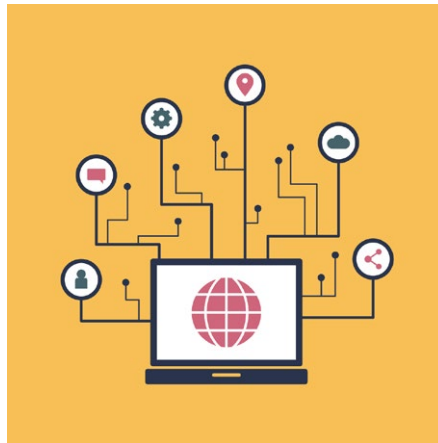
Taking part will be Revd Dr Peter Phillips, Research Fellow in digital theology at Durham University and Revd Chris Lee, vicar and founder of the Young Franciscans, a new monastic movement for young people.

The pandemic has brought about significant change, some of which we can already see and much which will only become apparent with time.

The days of the internet being a separate world from the one we physically inhabit are ending, as we move more and more freely between online and offline spaces, using our phones to shop as we sit in the living room, our tablets to communicate with family members that we can't meet and our PCs to hold work meetings on Zoom and Teams.

The church has been part of this transition as well, as we moved quickly and boldly in April 2020 to holding online services, offering recorded reflections and setting up WhatsApp prayer groups.

While we long to be able to sing, break bread and chat together, we also recognise the flexibility and possibilities for connection that an online presence offers. Many of us know of people who are connecting to church communities and exploring faith online for the first time. Today, nobody has to be free for a specific time on a particular day to hear the gospel preached. Nobody has to worry about the complexities of getting the kids out, or manoeuvring the wheelchair along the bumpy path to the church or walking into an unknown and alien church building for the first time. Now, there are ways to engage online which are accessible and available.



In the Diocese of Truro we have seen a flourishing of creativity, innovation and mission in this new and emerging world, and we do not want that to end as we emerge from lockdown.

As we return to gathered worship, we must not forget that much of the world that we are called to love in Christ's name, now lives and moves freely between the offline and online worlds and that, in order to connect with and serve them, we must do the same.

With that in mind, we are hosting a seminar on Zoom on June 15 from 7.30pm to 9pm.

Revd Dr Peter Phillips, Research Fellow in Digital Theology at Durham University, will share his thoughts, before Revd Chris Lee, an Instagram influencer with more followers than the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Church of England put together, will be telling all about how he's done it and how you can too. 'SYNOD OF THE CHILD' TAKES PLACE

The diocesan synod at the end of May was the 'synod of the child'.

As well as taking the lead on the opening and closing prayers, pupils also had the chance to give their views on lockdown, how they view their futures and the things they worry about in a series of videos played to synod members. Headteachers Hannah Stevens and Jennie Franklin spoke about their roles in leading schools.

There was also a sobering presentation from Mike Todd and Jess Meale from the Children's Society. They highlighted that 11,881 children in Cornwall are living with a mental health issue and 29% are living in poverty. Read the full [Children's Society report](#).

Archdeacon Kelly Betteridge made her synod debut and Kelly, along with Bishop Philip, were quizzed by some of the young pupils present.

Meeting as the Truro Diocesan Board of Finance (TDBF), the members received the Annual Report before re-appointing Haysmacintyre as the auditors and Veale Wasbrough Vizards LLP as the solicitors.

CONGREGATION DONATE COST OF A SHOT TO OTHERS FEOCK'S £1,700 VACCINE GIFT

From Cornwall with love ...

With Covid-19 still ravaging many parts of the world, the rush for vaccinations affects us all.

The congregation at St Feock has played its part in helping to get vaccines to people in poorer countries by raising almost £1,700.

Following a talk by Local Worship Leader Nina Davey about a UNICEF programme, which aims to get 2 billion Covid-19 vaccinations to people in over 190 of the poorest countries, St Feock's flock of 56 flew into action.

The following week, the congregation decided to try and give the equivalent of what their own vaccines would have cost if they had had to pay for one and the result was £1,697. This money will enable over 30,000 vaccinations to be given in developing countries.

PCC Secretary Rosalind Smith said: "It just shows what a massive difference one small village church and a congregation of 56 can make. We



hope this might encourage others to have a try."

The Rt Revd Philip Mounstephen, Bishop of Truro, said: "This really is an amazing effort and I want to give thanks to the whole congregation and say congratulations to you all. It's a great example of a committed collective community effort – and well worth sharing."

The Church of England is backing the VaccinAid campaign to 'Give the World a Shot' to help defeat Covid-19.

YOUNG PEOPLE CHALLENGE WORLD LEADERS

“Dear world leaders, our world is in crisis, it’s time to take a stand.” The opening words of an open letter written by 14 Cornish young people, addressed to the leaders of the G7 nations.

In it, the young people voice their fears about the climate crisis, asking world leaders to choose people and planet over profits, by limiting a rise in global temperatures to 1.5°C.

“We are one: one world, one creation, one humanity. Our planet is struggling and people are suffering, so while you’re visiting our patch ... we need you to act,” they write.

In June the leaders of the seven most influential countries in the world meet at Carbis Bay in Cornwall to discuss



the climate crisis. This will be followed by a larger gathering in Glasgow in November, COP26.

“As Christians, God asks us to love our neighbours, near and far. But your failure to act is putting their lives at risk. Today we are at a tipping point. We CAN stop this, but after decades of promises the action we need is still not happening.

When it comes to real action, profit is too often chosen over people and planet.”

The open letter, to which anyone can add their signature electronically, calls on some of the world’s most powerful leaders to end funding for fossil fuels, cut CO2 emissions to zero as fast as possible and to provide funding and support for world’s poorest communities as they adapt to climate changes that the world is already too late to prevent.

The letter which will be taken to Cornwall and Glasgow summits ends with this rallying call. “We ask you to act with us: a young generation taking a stand with our global community.” Read and sign the letter [here](#).

As the days lengthen and leaves unfurl in the ever warming air, as fresh shoots start to reveal new fruits, we are reminded of the changing seasons.

Maybe this is a season of change for you? Maybe you sense the urgency with which we must Cherish Creation, Cut Carbon and Speak Up? If so, I urge you **sign up** as a Creation Care Champion for your church, parish and community.

Greta is right about action and hope, but Jesus also taught us to pray.

I pray that you might know and see the goodness of Gods incredible, diverse and fragile creation all around us and that you might stand as a steward to safeguard this for the sake of all our futures.
