

Police Service of Scotland Community Council Meeting

Grangemouth Community Council

Date of meeting: 19th January 2023

Reporting period: 22/12/2022 – 19/01/2023

This report refers to the review period of 22nd December 2022 – 19th January 2023

During this period of review there have been 101 crimes reported to Police within the Community Council Area. 56 of these crimes are now detected or dealt with by alternatives to prosecution.

Incidents of Note

A drug warrant was executed at an address in Grangemouth with a quantity of class A drugs being seized. One person has been reported to the court for possession of class A drugs.

Crimes of Disorder and Violence

There have been 28 cases within the review period where violence or disorder has been present during the offence. 19 of these cases are marked as detected where an offender has been charged or warned.

0 hate crimes have been reported

Vandalism

8 Vandalisms have been reported to the police for this period, these are still in progress with open lines of enquiry.

Drugs

Over the review period there were 7 case involving drug misuse, 3 of which are detected.

The Community Team endeavour to investigate and develop any intelligence which comes directly from the community or elsewhere. We would encourage the residents of Grangemouth to provide any information about suspected drug offences directly to Police Scotland in strictest confidence by phoning 101 or anonymously by phoning Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

Road Traffic

There have been 10 road traffic incidents over the review period for various offences including driving while under the influence and driving without insurance.

Crimes of Dishonesty

There have been 18 crimes of dishonesty over the review period.
