# 9. To consider items for the Annual Parish Meeting and the March 2024 Parish Council meeting

Including Standing Orders, Financial Regs and GDPR Data Audit, Renewal of Insurance Cover and review of Clerks salary and hours.

# 6. To receive the Water Report from Jenny Walker and consider any financial expenditure.

Jenny Walker circulated the following report:

"The water supplied to the residents of Carlton continues to be safe to drink. Water usage was around 65-70 cubes per day until this recent icy-cold weather, when it increased overnight to 80 cubes on the first day and over 92 cubes/day each on the last two days. There have been no recent reports of leaks, yet perhaps, as the thaw is still to come.

The water from Melbecks to the top reservoir, and hence to the Water Hut, flows through the two temporary blue pipes. One of these two pipes has been almost completely blocked twice in the last couple of months. This reduces the pressure of water going through the filters in the Hut, but on these occasions did not affect the supply to the village. Both these blockages were associated with the tremendous rainfall we have had. It was fortunately possible to clear the pipe adequately on both occasions.

The fencing around the top reservoir has been replaced to make it stock-proof.

The annual service by Culligan has been booked, and a date is awaited."

Discussion then took place regarding the way forward with the renewal of the water plant.

Concerns were raised about the financial implications of the Parish Council signing up to Yorkshire Water, both in terms of raising the finance and the potential of unknown total cost since YW will not provide a definitive quote.

Concerns were raised about the legal standing of the council with regards to water and whether the document from the 1890's constitutes a legally binding water charter. The Clerk informed the meeting that legal advice had been sought from NYC, YLCA, NALC and specialist private water supply solicitors. Not one of these avenues has been able to provide any help. Withers Worldwide has been contacted by Dan Dent to request if advice is available and at what cost. The Clerk will forward any information received to the councillors.

**RESOLVED:** The council resolved to send a letter to each household outlining the following options:

- **Option 1** Full costing implications for the replacement and ongoing costs of the existing plant to be provided by the parish council under a new water charter.
- Option 2 Full costing implications for provision of water by YW. The considerable cost of this project and the financial implications for each resident is beyond the scope of the parish council and if this route is chosen, it will need to be undertaken by the residents.

If a way forward cannot be found, then there will be no other option but to inform NYC that the Parish Council is no longer able to progress and that help is required from them to resolve the situation.

This letter is to be sent around the 26<sup>th</sup> January giving residents time to digest the information before a village meeting to be held on 8<sup>th</sup> February to discuss a way forward.

Carol Little has asked for a meeting with the councillors and the Clerk is to contact Carol with suggested dates that she is available.
