Minutes of Meeting held on 19th January 2023

### Those present

Councillors Peter Dinsdale, Raymond Brown, Dinah Alonso-Wilkes and David Suttill and the Clerk, Marina Briggs, attended the meeting along with Jenny Walker from the Water Committee and 2 members of the community.

# 1. To receive apologies for absence

None received

### 2. To receive any declarations of interest and special dispensations

No declarations of interest were made.

# 3. To approve the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> October 2022 RESOLVED: The minutes from the last meeting were accepted as a true record and duly signed by the Chairman.

### 4. To receive any public questions, comments or representations

A member of the community had emailed regarding concerns about speeding traffic through the village and in particular by locals and farm traffic. Discussion regarding the issue ensued and the point was made that whilst farm traffic such as tractors appear to go fast due to their size, it is unlikely that they are exceeding the speed limit. Additionally, increased parking outside houses causes a natural traffic calming effect making speeding more unlikely.

RESOLVED: The council asked the clerk to respond to the email accordingly.

# 6. To receive the Water Report from Jenny Walker and consider any financial expenditure.

Jenny Walker circulated the following report:

"The water supply to the Water Hut continues to come from the temporary blue pipes behind the quarry face at the top of Melbecks. During the heavy rains last week, one of these pipes became blocked by debris and the supply to the Hut was affected. The filtration system does not function properly when the water is flowing through them at a low pressure. This blockage was cleared by Raymond on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> January, thank you.

The water supplied to the residents of Carlton has been safe to drink until today when a Boil Order notice needed to be distributed to all the residents.

Water usage by the village is expected to be 30-35 cubes per day. Evidence of a leak in the village has been present since last March, and usage was at 60-70 cubes per day since then until late November when it rose to over 80 cubes per day, and then in early December it rose to between 100-115 cubes per day. This massively increased usage had settled in the last week to 85-90 cubes per day.

Water usage increased to 95 cubes per day on Tuesday and Wednesday this week, and today, Thursday, it was 98 cubes. The water reservoir at the Hut was nearly empty at 8.30am today, and by 10am the residents at the top of the village had little water coming from their taps.

Raymond went up to the Hut and turned the By-pass on which allows more water into the reservoir, and on down to the village. This water is not properly filtered and is not chlorinated at all and hence the Boil Order notice was distributed.

I understand there has been no date given yet by the contractors to investigate and correct the leak at Butchers Bridge, and until that is done it is difficult to know whether further leaks exist unless they are visible. No additional visible leak has been identified in the village that I have been made aware of.

Permission by NYCC has been obtained for the disruption to the road in Carlton when this work is carried out, as well as the outstanding stop-tap replacement.

In order to maintain adequate reservoir levels of water for the village, this extra usage of water has meant that the Borehole has needed to be on, even when the water in Melbecks is clear, which it is now. The Borehole produces 29-30 cubes of water per day.

Electricity usage is 54-60 kWh per day when the Borehole is switched on and only 1-2 kWh per day when the Borehole is off.

Chlorine usage is proportionately higher when water usage is higher.

A Culligan engineer is booked to carry out the annual service on Tuesday 24th January."

Cllr Brown informed the meeting that Richards Water Solutions had been contacted and had provisionally said they would be carrying out the work by 27<sup>th</sup> January.

### 7. To review and update the parish risk assessment and asset register

Information from RDC about which properties pay business rates has been used to ensure all properties are included. Cragg View, Thirdale and Orchard Cottage are no longer businesses. The Old School and Heathlands have been added this year and pro rata'd from the date they were registered.

On the basis that the rents have been not been increased for a significant amount of time, the councillors amended the rental rates for the parish land as follows:

Bull Park - £200 (previously £180)
Parking Space by Beech Cottage - £30 (previously £25)
Melbecks - £60 (previously £40)

Cllr Suttill informed the meeting that he had checked the cattle trough in the Bull Park and found that it was still of solid construction. It has therefore not been replaced.
