#### **IMPORTANT REMINDER – CARLTON WATER SUPPLY**

The Parish Council is responsible for all repairs on the main supply water pipe, but the householder is responsible for any leaks that occur from the join onto the main supply pipe and on the service pipe to their property. You may wish to consider insurance to cover this eventuality - it is not necessarily covered by your normal house insurance. If you are unsure of what you are responsible for, then please contact the Parish Council as repairs can be costly!
