

Grant Aid

Awarded under Section 137(4)(A)/(3) of the Local Government Act 1972

This act allows expenditure on activities for which the Council has no other specific powers, if the Council considers that the expenditure is in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants in line with the Act. Expenditure is also permitted for certain charitable and other purposes.

Application for a Grant

The Community Council will consider applications for grants primarily from organisations and groups operating within the Councils area.

To this end the objectives in awarding funds will be to:

1. Encourage the participation of residents in community activities, improve the local economy, improve the local environment, include the less well-off in the community and foster engagement of young people in the life of the community.

2. Grant applications will therefore be considered in light of whether:

- the organisation is based in the local community and/or supports residents in the area
- the grant will enable more local people to participate in the organisation
- the grant will enable the organisation to apply for funding from other sources
- the grant will enable the organisation to support one or more of the Council's objectives

Awarding of Grants (Including the Free Use of Premises)

1. Applications received after the published **closing date of 31st October** will **not** be considered.

3. All Grant Aid Applications must be accompanied by **the last** income and expenditure statement of accounts for the organisation.

4. Grants will only be made to organisations and will not be made to individuals.

5. Organisations may apply for Free Use of the Councils premises under this scheme.

Personal Data

The completed application forms will be presented to Councillors at a meeting of the full Community Council. The details of the application will become a permanent public record in the minutes of that meeting.

The contact information for the application will be retained for up to seven years as an audit trail for the Councils expenditure and may be shared with relevant authorities as/when requested by them.
