
Open Reach.

Zurich Insurance

Cllr. Newsam confirmed that the Village Hall was insured with Zurich for a further year with no increase on last years premium. Cllr. Newsam suggested that cover for the building should be increased and that an Asset Register be compiled for the replacement cost of the contents and playground. He agreed to compile an Asset Register for further discussion.

Defibrillator

Cllr. Newsam confirmed that part funding had been officially granted through the Smile Foundation. This would cover the purchase of the Defibrillator, the cabinet and 8 years insurance. The balance of the cost would be funded with monies raised by the Village Hall Committee. Signs are to be erected to show the location of the Defibrillator. Cllr. Newsam will be the contact should any problems occur with the Defibrillator.

Environmental Agency

The Environmental Agency and Associated British Ports held a meeting with Skeffling and Welwick Parish Councils on the 28th January. This was to present and discuss their plans for the Managed Realignment Scheme before submission to the Planning Department at East Riding Council.

The Plan will create a new embankment habitat with viewing platforms. There will also be new footpaths and bridleways together with a new car park. It was also suggested that the pumping station may need to be upgraded.

It was suggested that a working group be set up to monitor progress of the construction work. This would be discussed further at future meetings.

Street Scene

Street Scene will take place on the 8th May.

Dog Fouling

Cllr. Newsam had received an email from the occupants of Church House regarding Dog Fouling on the river bank. They asked if it was possible to put up signs.

The river bank is not the responsibility of the Parish Council but Cllr. Newsam would contact the Environmental Agency and Yorkshire Wildlife Trust regarding this matter. He would inform the occupants of Church House.

Correspondence

Newsam confirmed that a letter from East Riding Council Planning Department had been received advising that EON had successfully appealed against the refusal to extend the operational period of the Out Newton Wind farm for another 5 years. The original permission was until 2022 so with the extension the site will be operational until 31st March 2027.
