that we do, and shared with us the joy
that can never be lost.

Now you give us his Body and Blood, and
we give ourselves to you. Through the
death and resurrection of your Son,
through the Holy Spirit who has been
given to us, we can make you our
eternal home.

So, with all Christians who are gathered
together today everywhere,
throughout the world, and with the
great procession of your Saints, as
brothers and sisters we pray to you, as
our Saviour has taught us:

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done, on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Do not bring us to the time of trial
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power
and the glory are yours,
now and for ever. Amen.**
