PC/07/03	Chairman's Report Prior to the meeting, Cllr Phipps had circulated a report for review to councillors prior to meeting: - Cllr Phipps commented on crime and disorder, Parish Plan, planning and enforcement, the Village Green, play equipment, free trees offer, Community Café and Jct 19. All are covered in the relevant sections.

PC/07/06	Parish Plan & Website — (a) Update by MAP - Cllr Phipps commented that to date he had received less that 40 responses to the development questionnaire. Whilst he has not completely analysed the results, the main views coming through are that residents liked living in a rural community, whilst still having access to the M5. 80% thought that a housing density of 30 per hectare would be too high and should be limited. Things they don't like is the lack of a local shop, and traffic and parking issues. Cllr Phipps will now convert the results into the Draft Neighbourhood Plan in "planning terminology". Currently NSC guidelines do not support villages joining up though development. Any development will make the traffic worse through the village, but if Jct 20 were to get a direct road link to Nailsea, then this would take a lot of pressure off of Portbury. Cllr Phipps has still to analyse the latter questions concerning each particular site. Cllr Phipps suggested that the next newsletter, which will contain a summary of the questionnaire responses, ought to be distributed by hand again. Cllr Phipps suggested a colour print this time and asked Cllrs to approve a budget cost of around £200. All agreed. Cllr Phipps is to attend a planning meeting on the 6 th July to hear about future planning requirements relating to housing numbers required in North Somerset.	MP

	(f) Free trees for November planting – Cllr Phipps reported that the	
	free tree offer is being repeated, and the trees will be available from	
	November. Cllr Phipps suggested using them to help screen the	
	motorway both at the playing fields and at Caswell Lane end of the	MP
	village. Permissions would be needed from landowners in both cases. Highways England may take the conifers out by the motorway and	
	PPC could put broad leaf trees in place. Cllr Ireland asked how big the	
	free trees would be. Cllr Phipps thought they would be 4-5ft high Cllr	
	Langdon commented that at Caswell Lane this would be ideal as a	
	screen to the motorway. Cllr Romanski suggested gaining the	
	relevant permissions first before accepting the offer. Mr Summerfield	
	commented that a strip of land owned by NSC separates the playing	
	field from the motorway. Mr Summerfield also suggested by Moor	
	Gate at the Sheepway as a site.

	residents what equipment they would like. (d)Community Café – Cllr Phipps reported that the July and August community café events would be held at the Church. As it is becoming more difficult for the café to cover its costs now, as the stall holders have reduced drastically. Cllr Phipps proposed that the Parish Council offer to cover the rent - which is £22 a month for the next 11 months – i.e. £242. Council were asked to consider this. Cllr Ireland commented that she would like to see the stalls back. Cllr Phipps commented that he would like to see the café back at the Village Hall during the winter months. Cllr Langdon commented that the feedback he received when the café moved to the church was very positive, also the parking is better there. It was resolved that PPC would offer to pay the rent in the hall for the next 6 months starting September 17. (e)Disabled/Wheelchair facilities in Portbury – Cllr Romanski is concerned that it can be difficult for wheelchair users to move around in Portbury. Cllr Phipps suggested that we could do more maintenance along the routes used by wheelchair/mobility scooter users. Cllrs Phipps and Romanski to look at routes and construct a list of areas that need attention. Also to discuss with NSC.	ALL MP/TR
PC/07/10	Transport and Traffic (a) M5 Footbridge update – Nothing to report (b) M5 Jct 19 update – Cllr Phipps via the Chairman's report commented that he had found a suitable sign for the docks in "The New Design Guide for Traffic Signage" and has written to HE with his findings. Cllr Phipps asked a driver of an Irish plated lorry recently stuck in Portbury about why he had used this route, and the driver responded that his satnav had sent him this way. He had ignored the 7.5T sign at the A369. Cllr Phipps is waiting for a response from NSC on enforceable weight limits. Cllr Phipps reported that there are now new road markings on the Jct 19 roundabout by the services and on the slip road.
