





Introduction and Key


- This slide pack is an attempt to document the Double Yellow Lines (DYLs) in central Aberfeldy which are in moderate to poor condition. There is no attempt to be 100% comprehensive and no comment or note is made of recently re-painted lines on Crieff Road and Moness Terrace which are in pristine condition.
- This is to facilitate necessary maintenance work. Greater road safety and less congestion are the goals.
- Ratings are: D = Dreadful M = Moderate G = Good
- Very subjective and of course truly gradational
- On the maps, Photo positions are shown thus: (purple)
- Specifically discussed segments thus: 26 (blue)
















Can we re-engineer things outside the chemist shop to provide a secure loading/unloading bay, rather than repainting the double yellow lines? The street view at right suggests that the carriageway width at this point is comparable to that part of Bank Street where parking on both sides is not causing problems. If we put the loading bay as suggested in the picture and removed the bit of fence outlined in red, and did some relevelling / ramping of the pavement, safe access to load / unload could be created without needing to remove all the fencing and create a hazard for pedestrians falling off the high kerb at this point (which I have presumed is why this fencing is there). Perhaps this could be a Loading Bay in the mornings and Disabled Parking in the Afternoon?





Extras

- There is a single yellow line (SYL) on Alma Avenue, also in poor condition. This was originally in place to restrict parking during the times school buses were going in and out, so as to facilitate safe turning out of the school grounds. This may have lapsed. The restrictions sign has gone. However, re-instating it might be one way round the exiting bus problem that is on the project list, but if not for re-instatement, it should be removed.
- One of the termination bars is still missing from the recently re-painted stripes on Crieff Road (adjacent to the entrance to Balnearn House B&B, south side)
