# WELSH ST DONATS COMMUNITY COUNCIL CYNGOR CYMUNED LLANDDWUDD MINUTES OF COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING ON 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2022

**PRESENT:** Councillors Emma Hall (in the Chair), Natalie Bosworth, Cheryl McNamee-Brittain, Kay Davies, Nigel England and Ann Thomas. Council Councillor Michael Morgan. Three members of the public.

**1.(49) PUBLIC FORUM:** The Chair welcomed members of the public and new Councillors.

Two residents from Welsh St Donats summarised their concerns (previously circulated to members of the CC and the Vale Council) over planning application 2022/00305/FUL South of Tv Mynvdd Farm.

Environmental issues including solar panels on prime farmland and finding suitable tracts of land for planting trees, were raised by another resident of Welsh St Donats.

- **3. (51) DECLARATION OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS**: Councillor Nigel England declared a personal interest in 2022/00808/FUL Pantwilkin Farm House, Llanquian Road, Aberthin.

ACTION: Clerk to add to online register

- **4. (52) MINUTES AND AGENDA:** the minutes meeting on 31st May and agenda were approved and signed. Those new members present signed acceptance of office forms. **ACTION:** Absent Councillor to sign at next meeting
- **5. (53) POLICE REPORT:** Since the last meeting there had been no reported crimes in May and in June an incident of online fraud in Welsh St Donats, no suspects identified.

#### 6. (54) REPORT FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR MICHAEL MORGAN:

**21/01379/FUL The Quarries, Bonvilston:** Michael Morgan confirmed that this application was being held up by environmental reports and agreed to speak on behalf of objectors if he deems it to be a matter of public interest. He also confirmed he would notify the Committee of this once the date for consideration by the Planning Committee is set. He noted a Councillor from Llancarfan would also be raising objections. Michael outlined the format for representations at the Planning Committee meeting, date as yet undecided. He urged residents to continue writing in to the Planning Officer with complaints and assured Councillors these would be included when the application was considered. Michael Morgan also recommended the voice of a resident at the Planning committee meeting to present objections. Cheryl McNameee-Brittain will consult with residents to secure a representative resident voice at the meeting.

**2022/00305/FUL South of Ty Mynydd Farm:** Michael Morgan had noted the concerns of residents and suggested this could be referred for determination by the Planning Committee.

**Rural Roads Policy:** a meeting with Vale Officers on 12<sup>th</sup> September has been arranged to discuss the policy. Residents are requested to email Michael Morgan their personal

experiences of sharing our narrow lanes with pushchairs, cyclists, farm vehicles, lorries, pedestrians, horse riders and cars so he could use these to highlight the need for action. A meeting with SW Police was also arranged.

Ann Thomas summarised the recent Welsh Government legislation for 20mph limits on restricted roads and noted that the responsibility lies with Vale Council to decide where limits should be 20mph and 30mph. She pressed for a 20mph limit and improved signage in Welsh St Donats to be raised at the meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> September and strongly urged that residents should be consulted.

The Chair thanked Michael Morgan for attending the meeting.

**1. To consider remaining vacancy on Community Council:** it was agreed that a resident in Highgrove, Ystradowen should be approached.

- **4. Signage in Tair Onen:** Cheryl McNamee-Brittain requested a site meeting with a member of NRW to discuss signage to direct visitors to correct entrances in Tair Onen. **ACTION:** Clerk to arrange site meeting.
- **5. To consider request to reinstate Churchyard maintenance grant**: after further discussion of recent information regarding grants for Churchyard maintenance and, following elections, new Council members with different views, it was agreed to forward comments from One Voice Wales to the internal auditor for his consideration. If his position remained unchanged, it was agreed to ask him for the reasons behind views in writing.

**6. The Quarries, Bonvilston:** this was discussed in the previous item. Residents of Tair Onen continue to report concerns over persistent blasting and related concerns, this is being investigated under ENF/2022/0237/PC
