# WELSH ST DONATS COMMUNITY COUNCIL CYNGOR CYMUNED LLANDDWUDD MINUTES OF COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING ON 10th April 2018

**PRESENT:** Councillors Nick Craddock (in the Chair), Glyn Jenkins, Graham Duffield, Andrew Foyle, and Ann Thomas. County Councillor Michael Morgan. From South Wales Police: PC Mark Goulding.

- **1 (168) PUBLIC FORUM:** No member of the public was present.
- 2 (169) RECEIVE APOLOGIES: Councillors Peter Castle and Mark Hastings
- **3 (170) DECLARATION OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS:** Nick Craddock declared an interest in Hendrewennol and Glyn Jenkins declared an interest in 16/00335/FUL Castell Talyfan. Both signed a proforma and stated that they would leave the meeting for any discussion.
- **4 (171) MINUTES AND AGENDA:** The minutes of the meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> March 2018 and agenda for current meeting were approved and signed.
- **5. (172) POLICE REPORT:** PC Mark Goulding reported a burglary and theft in Maendy of a vehicle, the vehicle was later recovered and an arrest was made. Residents were asked to be vigilant and report to SW Police any broken vehicles deposited in car parking areas or low loaders tipping car parts in the Hensol Forest. He also warned residents that rogue traders were around, wanting to remove waste materials. Residents should request to see a licence and ask where the waste is destined. Regarding the Community Council request for feedback on how burned out vehicles in the Forest were recorded by SW Police, Mark Goulding informed Councillors burned out vehicles were only recorded in the crime figures for the area in which the crime was committed. If no crime was involved, the burned out vehicle became, for example, a public safety concern, for which feedback was unavailable.

### 6 (173) REPORT FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR MICHAEL MORGAN:

Michael Morgan urged residents to view the plans for the proposed M4/A48 Link at the Vale Council, Barry, and make representations. The M4 Link will have an impact on, and implications for, the Welsh St Donats area, principally an increase in traffic on our already busy lanes. In March the Vale Council signed up to the City Deal which is aimed at providing funding to support schemes which are intended to stimulate the economic growth of the region. For further details go to the Vale Council website.

Details of proposed changes to limit the number of black refuse bags a household can have collected by the Council will follow. Households will be notified individually. Michael could find no evidence that the Vale Council will be liaising with town and

community councils and superfast broadband providers to get those as yet unconnected connected to a network.

Michael reiterated his concern for the poor condition of our roads and lanes.
