6 (462) REPORT FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR MICHAEL MORGAN:

Michael Morgan was not present at the meeting but informed the Clerk he would send in a report for circulation shortly.

7. (463) MATTERS ARISING:

(1) Castell Talyfan: The Clerk had sought an update from Vale Planning regarding the planning application (16/00335/FUL) for a change of use, which was submitted in 2016 but had not yet been determined. No reply had been received. Michael Morgan had agreed to take this up with the Vale Council at the last meeting and his response is awaited.

The Clerk reported that a hinge on the notice board at Highgrove had broken and was in need of repair. It was noted that two of the other six notice boards also showing signs of wear and weathering. Replacing or repairing notice boards is costly, so it was suggested that this might be the time to disseminate all Council information solely through the website. It was agreed to discuss this at the next meeting and get feedback for the suggestion by posting a notice on the boards to this effect.
