# WELSH ST DONATS COMMUNITY COUNCIL CYNGOR CYMUNED LLANDDWUDD MINUTES OF COMMUNITY COUNCIL REMOTE MEETING ON 4<sup>th</sup> August 2020

**PRESENT:** Councillors Ann Thomas, Mark Hastings, Nick Craddock, Graham Duffield and County Councillor Michael Morgan. It was agreed that Nick Craddock should chair the meeting in the absence of Emma Hall.

- **1 (565) PUBLIC FORUM:** The Clerk had not received any issues for this item. Following advice from One Voice Wales concerning public attendance at remote meetings, it was agreed to continue with current practice and request residents write in or email issues they would like raised at meetings. This information is on every agenda and in the updates on the website and notice board.
- **2 (566) RECEIVE APOLOGIES:** Councillors Emma Hall, Peter Castle and Glyn Jenkins
- **3 (567) DECLARATION OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS:** No member attending declared an interest.
- **4 (568) MINUTES AND AGENDA:** Minutes of the meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2020 and the agenda for this meeting were approved and signed.
- **5. (569) POLICE REPORT:** An emailed report from PC Stuart Elson stated there had been two reports of breach of covid regulations in May. In June and July two neighbourhood disputes, two burglaries (one commercial, the other residential) and an accident in Watery Lane involving a cyclist and car. The report also informed members that, shortly, a new officer would be allocated to the Peterston Ward and the Ward would fall under the umbrella of the Fairwater Team, rather than the Vale. Michael Morgan was not aware of this and said he would look into why this should be.

## 6.(570) REPORT FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR MICHAEL MORGAN:

The Vale Council was operating under emergency powers in planning and licensing. The Council was currently in recess but remote meetings would commence in September. **Fly tipping:** Michael Morgan was aware of the impact of fly tipping in Welsh St Donats and said he was involved in an ongoing case in St Georges where the Vale Council had traced down a contractor who had repeatedly tipped rubbish.

**Overgrown hedges:** Michael Morgan is in discussions with Mike Clogg at Vale Highways, however current conditions were hampering efforts to keep lanes clear.

**M4/A48 Link:** On Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> August Michael Morgan had convened a remote meeting with Emma Reed from Vale Transport Services to update Community Councils (Nick Craddock attended). A new report from the Cabinet was awaited and consultation on the options (east, west, upgrading existing road, or no new road) would follow. He felt an upgrade of the existing road was an unlikely option as it would be unsuitable for the required 60mph speed limit. Emma Reed was made aware of the effect the uncertainty was having on those living in and around Pendoylan and so with this in mind she intends

to announce a decision in January.

**Castell Talyfan :-** Michael Morgan said he was still looking into why the planning application had not yet been determined.

The Chair thanked Michael Morgan for his report. Michael thenleft the meeting.

# **7. (571) MATTERS ARISING:**

- **(2) FLY TIPPING:** Nick Craddock had drafted and circulated for approval a request from the Community Council to Colin Smith (Operational Manager for Neighbourhood Service Operations) for information as to how residents could report to the Vale Council details found in fly tipping that could aid identification of the perpetrator Also clarification was requested of how the Vale Council enforces and investigates fly tipping. The draft was approved.

(3) HENSOL FOREST - DAMAGE TO VERGES AND TRACKS: The Clerk had not yet had a response to the email sent to the Vale Council in early July regarding the damage to roads and verges following tree-felling works in Hensol Forest. It was agreed to re-send the email and the Clerk should prompt NRW in early autumn following their offer of a meeting between residents, Community Councillors and representatives of NRW to discuss issues following the tree-felling, regulations permitting.

**(4) Mirror at junction of Prisk Road and A4222:** It was agreed the Clerk should resend an email requesting clarification as to who is responsible for ensuring the mirror is not obscured by overgrown hedges.

**(5) Defibrillator for Welsh St Donats:** further details on installation had been circulated and these were discussed, however it was agreed that further discussion should be postponed to the next meeting when Emma Hall would be present.

**(6) Enforcement Unit website:** no response had been received from the Unit after a request to keep the website fully updated. However, it was agreed that request had been implemented.
